By the Honorable Singleton Bell, President Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of ~~xxxx~~
~~supervisors~~
~~wardens~~ of the Township of Covington, in the County aforesaid setting forth that
tain public road in said township, leading from a point at or near
Conoway's Farm to a point at or near the residence of Leopold Guenot,
Covington Township, of about two miles in length, has become useless,
is untravelled and its maintenance is burdensome upon the township

and, therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and vacate said road between the
points mentioned, whereupon the said Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and ap-
point from and among the County Board of Viewers John Scollins, E. D. Billotte, and

Geo. K. Weber who have been duly appointed by the said Court on the
County Board of Viewers, and filed their oaths of office in the office of the Court of Common Pleas of the
County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appoint-
ment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after
having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they
shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report
thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether
there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together
with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through
which said road passes.

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from
the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating
of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the
owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers
shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from
the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner trans-
mit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft, or plot, aforesaid. In which said reports they
shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given
of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE PEACE, IN AND FOR THE
COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD, PA.

We, the undersigned Viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of the view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County, and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of **Covington**, and that **three** notices thereof were posted along the route of the said road to be vacated, that the said view would be held on the

24th day of **March**, A. D. 19**25**, and that the public hearing, as required by the Act of Assembly, and the Rules of Court, would be held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield,

Pa., on the **26th** day of **March** A. D., 19 **25** at **two** o'clock P. M., and that said Viewers, appointed by the said order, viewed the road desired to be vacated, and that there were present at the view **Joseph Sayers, A. G. Viard, Supervisors, and Leopold Guenot, Frank Guenot, Charles Rougeux, M. M. Picard, O. B. Harrington, Ernest Rence, Henry Becker,**

parties interested, either in favor of or against vacating said road. And that the aforesaid hearing was held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the **26th** day of **March**,

And that after the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned Viewers do agree that said road has **not**, become useless, inconvenient and burdensome; **From the testimony produced it is evident that this Road is the shortest distance and on a practically level grade from the Pike to the Harrington Mine; that it is traveled every day, and by 14 or 15 miners living in the vicinity of Keewaydin, Mulsonburg and along the Pike, working at the Harrington Mine; that it is convenient for hauling mine supplies and freight to the above mine and a country store from the station at Karthaus.**

That a distance of 4 miles and roads of heavy grade are cut off by this Road; that very little money has been expended by the Township in the upkeep of this Road, and we therefore unanimously agree and find that it is necessary for the convenience of the residents and tax-payers of the Township and that the cost of its maintenance is no burden on the Township, and that the prayer of the petitioners be denied.

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and that a plan, or draft, of said road to be vacated showing the courses and distances, and over whose property the said road passes, is hereto attached and made a part hereof.

~~The undersigned Viewers further report that they endeavored to procure from all parties affected by the vacation of said road, or over whose properties said road passes, or in any way damaged by the vacating of said road, a release in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from the vacation thereof, and that they procured such release from:~~

And that the following persons having, in the opinion of the Viewers, been damaged by the vacation of said road, and having refused to release the damages to which they may be respectively entitled to by reason of the vacation, and closing up of the said road, we, the undersigned Viewers, after having considered the advantages to be derived to them, do assess them damages and make report thereof, as follows:

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

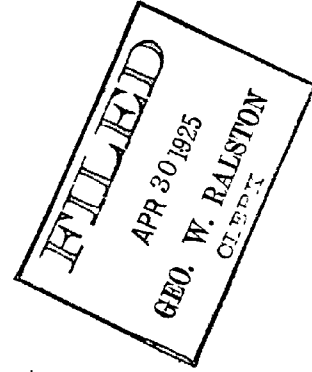

In Re: Petition to Vacate a public road in Covington Township.

To the Honorable, the Board of Viewers appointed on said View:

The subscribers hereto, being residents of the Township of Covington and Karthaus Townships, and persons using the public road, leading from Central Point to the property of Leopold Guenot, being two miles of road for which view is to be held to vacate, respectfully represent:

That the road is necessary for the subscribers to obtain their supplies from Karthaus stores and station, being a distance of about two miles, while if vacated, the subscribers would be required to travel more than four miles on very heavy grade; that the said road asked to be vacated has for the past few years had ten times more travel on it than at any other time in the past; that the opening of the mines in the locality has made it an absolute necessity and its vacation would bring upon the residents of the locality and the men employed at the mines undue and great hardship, by being obliged to travel more than double the distance and over hills of heavy grades;

Your petitioners therefore pray that, by reason of the distance and impassible roads rendering it impossible for petitioners to be present at the hearing, that they have due consideration in determining the necessity for said road. And they will ever pray.
