IN THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PA.

To the Honorable A. R. CHASE, President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

The petition of the undersigned, Supervisors of the Township of Woodward, County of Clearfield aforesaid, respectfully sheweth:

That many years ago a road was laid out leading from Lauthers' Mill to the eastern line of the Borough of Houtzdale; that a portion of said road was vacated upon the completion of the State Highway covering same route. That the only part of said road now in existence begins at the former location of the "Sterling stable" on the new State Highway, and ends at the eastern line of the said Borough of Houtzdale, passing through the Village of Sterling; that the portion of said road between the State Highway and the Village of Sterling passes over two railroads at grade, and crosses the Beaver Run, and is located on low marshy land, and is frequently flooded with water from the said Beaver Run; that your petitioners recently built a culvert to take the place of the condemned bridge, and conduct the water of Beaver Run under the road, but recent floods have not only made the culvert useless, but have destroyed and washed out the road in two places. Your petitioners further state that it will require a large amount of money to rebuild the road, and on account of the requirements of the State Highway Department a new bridge will be required which cannot be built for less than \$8000.00, making the Township's share almost \$3000.00; that the Township is now heavily in debt, and is without funds to repair said road or assist in the building of the bridge according to the specifications of the Highway Department. That the residents and inhabitants of that part of the Township served by the said road have free access to the State Highway by the road leading through the Borough of Houtzdale, and that your petitioners believe that the vacation of said road will not inconvenience any

of the residents or inhabitants or the traveling public. *and that*
the road has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome,
Your petitioners therefore pray the Court that the said road
may be vacated agreeably to the act of the General Assembly in such
case made and provided; and they will ever pray, etc.

County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment,
with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after
having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they
shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report
thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether
there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together
with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through
which said road passes.

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from
the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating
of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the
owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers
shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from
the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner trans-
mit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft, or plot, aforesaid. In which said reports they
shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given
of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.
