To the Honorable A.R.Chase, President-Judge of said Court:

The petition of the undersigned Supervisors
of Girard Township respectfully represents:

FIRST: That the road leading from Clearfield to
Karthaus, beginning at a point at Al Murrays and extending to the
intersection of the Clearfield & Karthaus road at the point of
intersection of the Congress Hill road, which leads to the Mur-
ray Grave Yard, is very mountainous and dangerous for the travel-
ing public and further, is very burdensome and costly for the
Township to keep in repair.

SECOND: That this section of road can be avoided by
building a new road beginning at a point at Al Murray's watering
trough and extending to a point on the Congress Hill road, which
leads to the Murray Grave Yard, a distance of approximately
seventy-five (75) rods.

THIRD: That the township of Girard intends to build
a new section of road from Al Murrays and extending over what is
known as the Clearfield & Karthaus road, the same being an ex-
tension of the State road constructed by the township of Girard
in 1926 under the State Award plan.

FOURTH: That to eliminate the necessity of expending
large sums of money in grading the steep and mountainous section
above referred to, which begins and extends to the point above
designated, the Supervisors of Girard think it advisable to
change the route as laid out by extending a survey from a point
at Al Murray's watering trough to a point on the Congress Hill
road, which would eliminate the building of this new road over

the mountainous section referred to.

Your petitioners therefore pray the Court to
and
appoint proper persons to view and vacate the old road, to lay
out a new road between the point\$ above designated, according to
law.

And they will ever pray, etc.



By the Honorable ~~Shigetaka~~ ~~W. E. B. E. M.~~, President Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of ~~Shigetaka~~ ~~W. E. B. E. M.~~ inhabitants of the Township of Girard, in the County aforesaid setting forth that the road leading from Clearfield to Karthaus, beginning at a point at Al Mumays and extending to the intersection of the Clearfield & Karthaus road at the point of intersection of the Congress Hill road, which leads to the Murray Grave Yard, is very mountainous and dangerous for the traveling public and further, is very costly for the township to keep up.

That this section of road can be avoided by building a new road beginning at a point at Al Murray's watering trough and extending to a point on the Congress Hill road, which leads to the Murray Grave yard, a distance of approximately 75 rods.

That the Twp. of Girard intends to build a new section of road from Al Murray's and extending over what is known as the Clearfield & Karthaus road, the same being an extension of the State road constructed by the Twp. of Girard in 1926 under the State Award plan.

That to eliminate the necessity of expending large sums of money in grading the steep and mountainous section above referred to, which begins and extends to the point above designated, the Supervisors of Girard think it advisable to change the route as laid out by extending a survey from a point at Al Murray's watering trough to a point on the Congress Hill road, which would eliminate the building of this new road over the mountainous section referred to

and, therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and vacate said road between the points mentioned, whereupon the said Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and ap-

point from and among the County Board of Viewers John Sollins, Esq., Harry Reese and George Weber who have been duly appointed by the said Court on the

County Board of Viewers, and filed their oaths of office in the office of the Court of Common Pleas of the County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through which said road passes.

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft, or plot, aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE PEACE, IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD, PA.

We, the undersigned Viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of the view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County, and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Girard, and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the said road to be vacated, that the said view would be held on the

4th day of May, A. D. 19 27, and that the public hearing, as required by the Act of Assembly, and the Rules of Court, would be held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield,

Pa., on the 5th day of May, A. D., 19 27 at nine o'clock A.M., and that said Viewers, appointed by the said order, viewed the road desired to be vacated, and that there were present at the view: Q. E. Beauseigneur, Supervisor, Al Murray and Mrs. Al Murray

parties interested, either in favor of or against vacating said road. And that the aforesaid hearing was held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 5th day of May, ,

A. D. 19 27, when the parties interested in the said road were in attendance: Q. E. Beauseigneur, Supervisors, with A. B. Shaw, Esq., as counsel, and Al Murray.

Q. E. Beauseigneur and Al Murray sworn, examined and cross-examined by counsel and your Board.

And that after the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned Viewers do agree that said road ~~has become inconvenient and burdensome~~ leading from Karthaus to Clearfield is necessary; but that portion thereof beginning at a point at the Al Murray watering trough and thence extending South 82 degrees 15 minutes West 687 feet and ending at the intersection of the aforesaid Road with the Congress Hill Road, at the Murray Grave-yard, has become inconvenient, burdensome and dangerous for public travel, owing to the steep grade of the aforesaid portion thereof, and in the opinion of your Board should and is hereby recommended to be vacated, and supplied by a Road to be built beginning at the water trough of Al Murray aforesaid and thence extending South 59 degrees 30 minutes West through improved land of Al Murray 768 feet to post on the Congress Hill Road, to eliminate the excessive grade and which new road is necessary, more convenient and less burdensome of upkeep.

and that a plan, or draft, of said road to be vacated showing the courses and distances, and over whose property the said road passes, is hereto attached and made a part hereof.

The undersigned Viewers further report that they endeavored to procure from all parties affected by the vacating of said road, or over whose properties said road passes, or in any way damaged by the vacating of said road, a release in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from the vacation thereof, ~~and~~
~~that they procured such release from~~

And that the following persons having, in the opinion of the Viewers, been damaged by the vacation of said road, and having refused to release the damages to which they may be respectively entitled to by reason of the vacation, and closing up of the said road, we, the undersigned Viewers, after having considered the advantages to be derived to them, do assess them damages and make report thereof, as follows:

ORDER TO VACATE

Reviewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
