CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the 19 day of June A. D. 1863 before the Judges of the said Court upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Perry in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway to lead from the Public Road on line between Elesha Moore & David Sharp aforesaid to a point at or near the line between Catholie Congregation tract and Jeremiah Moore's

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Sho^{ds} Moore, David Sharp and John Russell who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

Be the Viewers appointed by the fore-going Order of Court to view the road therein described, do report, That in pursuance of said appointment after having ten days Notice by printed and written advertisements put up according to Law of the time and place of said view and publication having been given to Owners and occupants of lands through which said road passes of the same - And having Enquired of damages resulting to any one by reason of the passage of said road have ascertained that no damage results to any one and having been duly affirmed we have viewed said road and do return for Public use the following road Beginning at a Post at public road on line of Elisha Moore and Tho. A. Moore thence along said line North five degrees East. Eighty three perches to stone corf of T. A. Moore thence through land of Jeremiah Moore North Eighteen degrees East One hundred and six perches thence through land of the same and Catholic Congregations lands North Twenty seven degrees East. Thirty perches to line of Jeremiah Moore thence by line of said Jeremiah Moore and Catholic Congregations lands North two and one half degrees East Ten perches to Public road leading from Remmills to the Irish Settlement - A plot or draft of which we herewith annex On testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands this twenty second day of July 1865
