At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, Pa., held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 30th day of July in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and twenty eight

By the Honorable ~~Stephen~~ ^{John} President Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of sundry and supervisors inhabitants of the Township of BRADFORD, in the County aforesaid setting forth that ~~a road~~ long since laid out leading from Pleasant Valley Church to Egypt from a point near the John Goodrow residence and ending at or near the residence of F. L. Conoway, is steep, hard to keep up and drifts in winter so it cannot be traveled, your petitioners therefore pray the Honorable Court to appoint viewers to vacate that portion of the above mentioned public road and supply the same with a new road from the said John Goodrow's residence to the said F. L. Conoways residence and they will ever pray.

and, therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and vacate said road between the points mentioned, whereupon the said Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and ap-

point from and among the County Board of Viewers John Scollins, Esq., Ed. Billotte and Jesse Dale who have been duly appointed by the said Court on the

County Board of Viewers, and filed their oaths of office in the office of the Court of Common Pleas of the County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through which said road passes.

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft, or plot, aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE PEACE, IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD, PA.

We, the undersigned Viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of the view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County, and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Bradford, and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the said road to be vacated, that the said view would be held on the

18th day of September, A. D. 1928, and that the public hearing, as required by the Act of Assembly, and the Rules of Court, would be held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield, the View and Hearing having been continued 2 weeks by agreement and after notice to all parties in interest, on the 21st day of September A. D., 1928, at 10:00 o'clock A.M., and that said Viewers, appointed by the said order, viewed the road desired to be vacated, and that there were present at the view: A. B. Lansberry and W. H. Kephart, Supervisors; and John Goodrow.

parties interested, either in favor of or against vacating said road. And that the aforesaid hearing was held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 21st day of September, A. D. 1928, when the parties interested in the said road were in attendance: Carl A. Belin, Esq., Attorney for petitioners, with A. B. Lansberry and W. H. Kephart, Supervisors.

A. B. Lansberry and W. H. Kephart, sworn, examined and cross-examined by counsel and your Board.

And that after the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned Viewers do agree that said road has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome, to wit: Beginning at a post on the Township Road leading from Pleasant Valley Church to Egypt; thence South 67 degrees 30 minutes East 100 feet to a post; thence South 85 degrees East 200 feet to a post; thence North 76 degrees East 100 feet to a post; thence South 74 degrees East 200 feet to a post; thence South 80 degrees 30 minutes East 500 feet to a post; thence South 85 degrees East 353 feet and ending at a post in said public Road.

That owing to its steep grades it has fallen into disuse by the public and becomes impassable in winter with drifting snow, and is therefore recommended for vacation.

We further find and agree that there is necessity for a public road for the use and convenience of the traveling public and recommend that a public road be supplied:

Beginning at the end of the public road proposed to be vacated (herein above described) thence North 50 degrees West 300 feet to a post; thence North 65 degrees West 50 feet to a post; thence North 83 degrees West 750 feet to a post; thence North 65 degrees West 100 feet to a post; and thence North 83 degrees 30 minutes West 100 feet and ending in the public road leading from Pleasant Valley Church to Egypt.

The road herein proposed for public use passes over a uniform grade and is now in constant use, through the property of John Goodrow, who claims no damage in view of

the benefits to be derived thereby personally by him.

and that a plan, or draft, of said road to be vacated showing the courses and distances, and over whose property the said road passes, is hereto attached and made a part hereof.

The undersigned Viewers further report that they endeavored to procure from all parties affected by the vacation of said road, or over whose properties said road passes, or in any way damaged by the vacation of said road, a release in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from the vacation thereof, and that they procured such release from:

And that the following persons having, in the opinion of the Viewers, been damaged by the vacation of said road, and having refused to release the damages to which they may be respectively entitled to by reason of the vacation, and closing up of the said road, we, the undersigned Viewers, after having considered the advantages to be derived to them, do assess them damages and make report thereof, as follows:

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.




