In re:Petition to vacate road
in Union Township. }

To the Honorable A.R.Chase, President-Judge of said Court:

The un-
dersigned Supervisors of the Township of Union respectfully
represent:-

FIRST: That there are certain roads in said Township which have long since been laid out as township roads but have through time become abandoned to the use of the general public and in some instances are used exclusively as private roads or lanes, the first thereof being a portion of the road extending from Winterborn to Home Camp, being approximately one and one-fourth miles in length, beginning at the Houston Township line and extending in a southerly direction through the Jack Marsh farm, the second thereof being a road of approximately five to six hundred feet in length, beginning at a point on the road leading from Home Camp to DuBois and extending inward to what is known as the Henry Larock property, the third thereof being a road of approximately one-half mile in length, beginning at a point on the Rockton road, commonly known as the Gelunt place near Amos Clowser and extending along said road a distance of approximately one-half mile to what is known as the over head bridge.

SECOND: That to keep and maintain said roads or sections of road at the expense of Union Township has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome.

Your petitioners therefore pray your Honorable Court that the roads or sections of road hereinabove mentioned may be vacated agreeably to the Act of Assembly in such case made and

provided.
