At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, Pa., held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 15th day of Sept in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and thirty one
A. R. CHASE
By the Honorable ~~Washington~~ President Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Boggs, in the County aforesaid setting forth that
a road in said Township beginning at the Bethlehem School House and ending at the Bradford Township line has become useless and unnecessary and is burdensome and expensive to keep up

and, therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and vacate said road between the points mentioned, whereupon the said Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and ap-

point from and among the County Board of Viewers John Scollins Esq.,

Harry Reese and H. P. DOWLER who have been duly appointed by the said Court on the County Board of Viewers, and filed their oaths of office in the office of the Court of Common Pleas of the County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through which said road passes.

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft, or plot, aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE PEACE, IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD, PA.

We, the undersigned Viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, ^{to No. 2 December Sessions, 1931} beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of the view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County, and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Boggs, and that three notices

thereof were posted along the route of the said road to be vacated, that the said view would be held on the

15th day of October, A. D. 1931 and that the public hearing, as required by the Act of Assembly, and the Rules of Court, would be held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield,

Pa., on the 19th day of October A. D., 1931, at ten o'clock A. M., and that said Viewers, appointed by the said order, viewed the road desired to be vacated, and that there were present at the view: J. W. Lansberry, E. E. Burns and Clark Goss, Supervisors of Boggs Township. Alice Zeigler, Howard Schickling and John Schickling.

parties interested, either in favor of or against vacating said road. And that the aforesaid hearing was held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 19th day of October,

A. D. 1931, when the parties interested in the said road were in attendance: Walter Welch, Esq., with E. E. Burns and J. W. Lansberry, Supervisors, petitioners. Howard Stewart, an officer of the B. & L. Ass'n. E. E. Burns, J. W. Lansberry and Howard Stewart sworn, examined and cross-examined by counsel and your Board.

And that after the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned Viewers do agree that said road has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome as a public Road, to wit:

Beginning at its intersection with the public road leading from Wallaceton to Krebs, near the Bethlehem School House; thence North 69 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East along improved lands of John Schickling 1030 feet; thence North 52 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East 300 feet; thence North 46 $\frac{1}{4}$ degrees East 83 feet; thence North 49 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East 491 feet; thence North 36 degrees East 216 feet; thence North 58 degrees East 85 feet and thence North 30 degrees East 128 feet and ending at the Bradford Township line.

We further find that the aforesaid Road passes over a hill of steep grades and is infrequently traveled, but that it does accommodate a few children attending Bethlehem School from the vicinity of Visor Hollow, but the vehicular travel is better served by the public road in Bradford Township leading to the Highway and connecting near Litz Bridge, which road is of uniform grade and not dangerous.

However, we recommend that the aforesaid described road be and remain a private road of the width of 25 feet for the use and benefit of the owners of lands through or along which it passes, as well as the residents of Visor Hollow, to be maintained and used as private roads are now maintained and used under existing Laws.

Reviewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
