At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, Pa., held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 16th day of April in the year of our Lord, one

By the Honorable ~~Stephen Kelly~~ President Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of sundry

inhabitants of the Township of Graham, in the County aforesaid setting forth that ~~there~~ has been long since laid out a public road beginning at a point at ~~Grayhampton~~ and thence in the Easterly Direction to the town of Kylertown, Cooper Twp. being a distance of approximately 6 miles.

That a portion of the road described in paragraph 2, beginning at ~~Grayhampton~~ and then extending in an easterly direction to the Black Oak School House being a distance of approximately 2 1/2 miles has been vacated.

That a portion of the said road described in Paragraph 2 beginning at Black Oak School House; thence in an Easterly direction at a point where said road intersects the road leading from Kylertown to the Bigler Allport cut off, a distance of approximately 2 miles, has long since been useless and inconvenient and burdensome. The intersection referred to on the road leading from Kylertown to Bigler Allport cut off is the first intersection that the road leading from Grayhampton to Kylertown intersects.

and, therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and vacate said road between the points mentioned, whereupon the said Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and ap-

point from and among the County Board of Viewers John Scollins, Esq., Harry Reese and H. P. Dowler who have been duly appointed by the said Court on the

County Board of Viewers, and filed their oaths of office in the office of the Court of Common Pleas of the County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through which said road passes:

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft, or plot, aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE PEACE, IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD, PA.

We, the undersigned Viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, <sup>to No. 5, May Sessions, 1931</sup> beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of the view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County, and the Board of Supervisors

of the Township of Graham, and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the said road to be vacated, that the said view would be held on the

9th day of June, A. D. 1931, and that the public hearing, as required by the Act of Assembly, and the Rules of Court, would be held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield,

Pa., on the 12th day of June A. D., 1931, at ten o'clock A. M., and that said Viewers, appointed by the said order, viewed the road desired to be vacated, and that there were present at the view: James Bock and Walter Hubler, Supervisors of Graham Township,

parties interested, either in favor of or against vacating said road. And that the aforesaid hearing was held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 12th day of June,

A. D. 1931, when the parties interested in the said road were in attendance: James Bock and Walter Hubler, Supervisors of Graham Township, who being sworn, examined and cross-examined by your Board.

And that after the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned Viewers do agree that said road has ----, become useless, inconvenient and burdensome find, to wit: --

The hereinafter described portion of that public road beginning at a point at Grahampton and leading thence in an Easterly direction to the Town of Kylertown, beginning at a post at its intersection with the road leading from the State Highway to Deer Creek, near the Black Oak School House; thence along lands of Henry Evans and E. K. Smeal South  $82\frac{1}{2}$  degrees East 946 feet to a post; thence South  $77\frac{1}{2}$  degrees East 619 feet to post on unimproved land of T. H. Forcey Estate; thence thereby South 82 degrees East 622 feet to a post; thence South 69 degrees East 304 feet to a post; thence South 62 degrees East 995 feet to Alder Run; thence South 74 degrees East 467 feet to a post; thence South  $61\frac{1}{2}$  degrees East 540 feet to a post; thence South 80 degrees East 245 feet to a post; thence North 83 degrees East 354 feet to a post; thence North 73 degrees East 465 feet to a post; thence North 84 degrees East 572 feet to post on lands of B. D. Schooner Estate; thence thereby South 78 degrees East 612 feet to a post; thence South 64 degrees East 360 feet to a post; thence South  $59\frac{1}{2}$  degrees East 710 feet to a post; thence South  $52\frac{1}{2}$  degrees East 1257 feet to a post; thence South 62 degrees East 897 feet to a post; thence South 71 degrees East 313 feet to a post on lands of Orwig Bros.; thence thereby South  $76\frac{1}{2}$  degrees East 802 feet to a post; and thence South 57 degrees East 1011 feet and ending at the intersection

of said Road with the public road leading to the State Highway.

We further find that the aforesaid Road is inconvenient, burdensome and useless for public travel; that it passes over much unimproved land with no inhabitants thereon and at either extremity thereof owners have more convenient outlets to improved public roads, and are petitioners for its absolute vacation, which your Board therefore recommends.

and that a plan, or draft, of said road to be vacated showing the courses and distances, and over whose property the said road passes, is hereto attached and made a part hereof.

The undersigned Viewers further report that they endeavored to procure from all parties affected by the vacation of said road, or over whose properties said road passes, or in any way damaged by the vacating of said road, a release in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from the vacation thereof, and that they procured such release from:

And that the following persons having, in the opinion of the Viewers, been damaged by the vacation of said road, and having refused to release the damages to which they may be respectively entitled to by reason of the vacation, and closing up of the said road, we, the undersigned Viewers, after having considered the advantages to be derived to them, do assess them damages and make report thereof, as follows:



TO THE HONORABLE A. R. CHASE, P. J.:

Your petitioners respectfully represent:

FIRST: That James Bock, Fred Koble and Walter Hubler, are the duly authorized Supervisors of the Township of Graham, County of Clearfield and State of Pennsylvania, and that James Bock is Secretary and Treasurer and Fred Koble is the President of the Board.

SECOND: That there has been long since laid out a public road beginning at a point at Grayhampton and thence in the Easterly direction to the town of Kylertown, Cooper Township Pennsylvania, being a distance of approximately six (6) miles.

THIRD: That a portion of the road described in paragraph two (2), beginning at Grayhampton and then extending in an Easterly direction to the Black Oak School House being a distance approximately two and one half (2 1/2) miles has been vacated.
