At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, Pa., held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 15th day of Sept in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and thirty one

By the Honorable ^{A. R. CHASE} ~~Singleton Bell~~, President Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Boggs, in the County aforesaid setting forth that a road beginning at the Salem Church at the ash road leading from the Cross-road, known at Stone Corner Cross-road and ending at the State Highway, being a distance of about seven-tenths of a mile, has become useless

and, therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and vacate said road between the points mentioned, whereupon the said Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers John Scollins, Esq., Harry Reese

and H.P. Dowler who have been duly appointed by the said Court on the County Board of Viewers, and filed their oaths of office in the office of the Court of Common Pleas of the County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through which said road passes.

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft, or plot, aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE PEACE, IN AND FOR THE
COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD, PA.

We, the undersigned Viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, ^{to No. 7, December Sessions, 1931} beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of the view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County, and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Boggs, and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the said road to be vacated, that the said view would be held on the

14th day of October, A. D. 19 31, and that the public hearing, as required by the Act of Assembly, and the Rules of Court, would be held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield,

Pa., on the 19th day of October A. D., 1931, at ten o'clock A.M., and that said Viewers, appointed by the said order, viewed the road desired to be vacated, and that there were present at the view: Clark Goss, J. W. Lansberry and E. E. Burns, Supervisors of Boggs Township, and Morris W. Shimmel,

parties interested, either in favor of or against vacating said road. And that the aforesaid hearing was held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 19th day of October,

A. D. 19 31, when the parties interested in the said road were in attendance: Walter Welch, Esc., with E. E. Burns and J. W. Lansberry, Supervisors, petitioners; and Morris W. Shimmel. E. E. Burns, J. W. Lansberry and Morris W. Shimmel, sworn, examined and cross-examined by counsel and your Board.

And that after the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned Viewers do agree that said road has , become useless, inconvenient and burdensome as a public Road, beginning at a post South 67 degrees East 900 feet from the intersection of said Road with the Township Road (or State Highway) opposite Salem Church; thence South 67 degrees East 1002 feet along improved lands of Morris Shimmel to a post; thence thereby South 52 degrees East 600 feet to a post; thence South 59 degrees East along unimproved lands 600 feet to a post; thence South 49 degrees East 675 feet and ending at the public (Ash) Road leading to Wallaceton.

We further find as a fact that the aforesaid portion of the aforesaid Road serves the private interests of Morris W. Shimmel and Ralph Bodle, and therefore recommend that the aforesaid portion of said Road be and remain a private road of the width of 25 feet, for the use and benefit of the owners of lands through or along which it passes to be maintained and used as private roads are now maintained and used under existing laws.

Secondly: We further find that that portion of said road as originally laid out beginning at the intersection of said Road with the Township Road (or State Highway) opposite Salem Church; and thence running South 67 degrees East 900 feet to the lane of Morris W. Shimmel be retained as necessary for public use and that we are of the opinion that there is no cause for vacating that portion thereof.

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.

Also, viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

Reviewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
