2. Road beginning at the Huston Township line at the Naugle place, continuing to the Levi Dressler place on the Home Camp - Narrows Creek road.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 30th day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred thirty one

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of UNION

in said County, setting forth that two certain roads lying in the township of Union has become useless and should be vacated as follows:

- 1st. Road leading from Adam Korb's residence through to the intersection of the Rockton - Home Camp road at the Henry Bailey place.
- 2nd . Road beginning at the Huston Township line at the Naugle place, continuing to the Levi Dressler place on the Home Camp - Narrows Creek Road.

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to re view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers John Scollins, Esq., ED. BILLOTTE and H. P. DOWLER

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgement, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may, be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing

parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the ^{Grand Jury} ~~Arbitration~~ Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 11th day of January A. D. 1923, when the following appearances were noted: As to 1st Road: J. C. Arnold, Esq., Solicitor for Union Township; J. C. Pentz, Esq., for petitioners; J. H. Riddle, P. A. Sheeser, H. N. G. Schwem: all sworn, examined and cross-examined by Counsel and your Board.

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is no occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is not necessary for a private road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for private use the following described road, to wit ~~Beginning~~ First: Beginning at the residence of Adam Korb on the Rockton Pike, thence along land of Adam Korb North 27 degrees West 517 feet to a post; thence thereby North 31 degrees 15 minutes West 300 feet to post; thence along land of Seyler Heirs North 38 degrees West 217 feet to a post; thence still thereby North 41 degrees 45 minutes West 300 feet to a post; thence still thereby North 45 degrees 15 minutes West 100 feet to a post; thence still thereby North 54 degrees West 200 feet to a post; thence still thereby North 71 degrees 15 minutes West 185 feet to a post; thence along lands of Seyler Heirs and State Land North 61 degrees West 700 feet to post; thence along State lands North 49 degrees 45 minutes West 190 feet to a post; thence over lands of the City of DuBois North 40 degrees 30 minutes West 100 feet to a post; thence still thereby North 56 degrees 15 minutes West 50 feet to a post; thence still thereby North 87 degrees 45 minutes West 50 feet to a post; thence still thereby South 53 degrees West 50 feet to a post; thence still thereby South 35 degrees West 200 feet to a post; thence still thereby South 46 degrees 45 minutes West 300 feet to a post; thence still thereby South 50 degrees West 70 feet to a post; thence still thereby South 79 degrees 30 minutes West 180 feet to a post; thence still thereby and across Anderson Creek South 89 degrees West 110 feet to a post; thence still thereby North 58 degrees West 130 feet to a post; thence still thereby North 26 degrees West 160 feet to a post; thence still thereby North 19 degrees West 533 feet to a post; thence still thereby North 20 degrees West 110 feet to a post and thence still thereby North 91/4 degrees West 300 feet and ending in the Pinchot Improved Highway leading from Rockton to DuBois via Home Camp, at the Henry Bailey place.

We further find that by proceedings had to No. 7, September

Sessions, 1931, the aforesaid described road was recommended for vacation by the original Board of Viewers, which Report was confirmed ni. si. by your Honorable Court. On November 30th, 1931, upon petition of sundry citizens of Union Township the undersigned were appointed as a Board of Re-View.

After view and hearing your Board finds that the aforesaid Road serves a farming community, as well as custom-coal mines, and serves as a short-cut to the Pinchot Improved Rural road; a large portion of it passing through the woods-land and water-shed of the City of DuBois Water Supply Reservoir, opposing its vacation. It passes over hilly terrain and is not expensive to keep up, does not drift in winter and serves as a U. S. Mail route and for traveling to and from Home Camp Church.

The road being already opened and laid out for years, your Board recommends that it remain as a private road, to be maintained as provided by Act of Assembly.

SECOND: Beginning at the Huston Township line at land of DuBois Outing Club and thence running over the Chas. Blanchard lands (now owned by C. G. Schwem) the following courses and distances, to wit: South 55 degrees 30 minutes East 134 feet; thence South 44 degrees East 200 feet; thence South 36 degrees 45 minutes East 280 feet; thence South 30 degrees East 100 feet; thence South 9 degrees East 100 feet; thence South 4 degrees 45 minutes East 200 feet; thence South 3 degrees 30 minutes East 132 feet; thence South 7 degrees 30 minutes West 100 feet; thence South 22 degrees 15 minutes West 290 feet; thence South 8 degrees East 100 feet; thence South 21 degrees East 377 feet; thence South 50 degrees 30 minutes West 200 feet; thence South 11 degrees 15 minutes West 132 feet to land now of Z. Marsh; thence thereby South 30 minutes East 200 feet; thence thereby South 7 degrees 30 minutes West across Coal Run 110 feet to line of land of Mike Miller; thence along lands of Chance Bailey and Mike Miller South 7 degrees 30 minutes West 327 feet; thence still thereby South 32 degrees 30 minutes West 100 feet; thence still thereby South 52 degrees West 286 feet; thence still thereby South 79 degrees West 145 feet to line of land of Fred Weber; thence thereby South 87 degrees 30 minutes West 585 feet; thence thereby South 74 degrees West 220 feet to line of land of Jos. Bowersox Heirs; thence thereby South 65 degrees 45 minutes West 100 feet; thence thereby South 57 degrees 15 minutes West 400 feet; thence thereby South 51 degrees West 200 feet; thence thereby South 44 degrees 30 minutes West 850 feet and ending at intersection of Road leading from Home Camp to Narrows Creek.

We further find that a portion of this Road is necessary, useful and convenient for Fred Weber as an outlet, and the whole of it inexpensive to maintain, having a schale foundation and known as the ridge road leading from Home Camp to Sabula Lake via the DuBois Outing Club, a recreation centre of said organization and in constant use in going to said Club-house, the Game Reserve and Auxiliary Forest by the members, friends and visitors. Being maintained for public recreation, your Board recommends that the aforesaid road be re-opened as a public road.






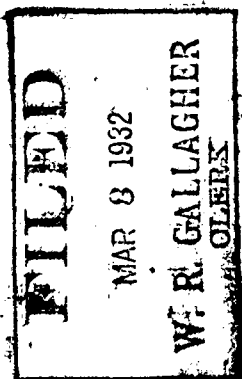
NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.

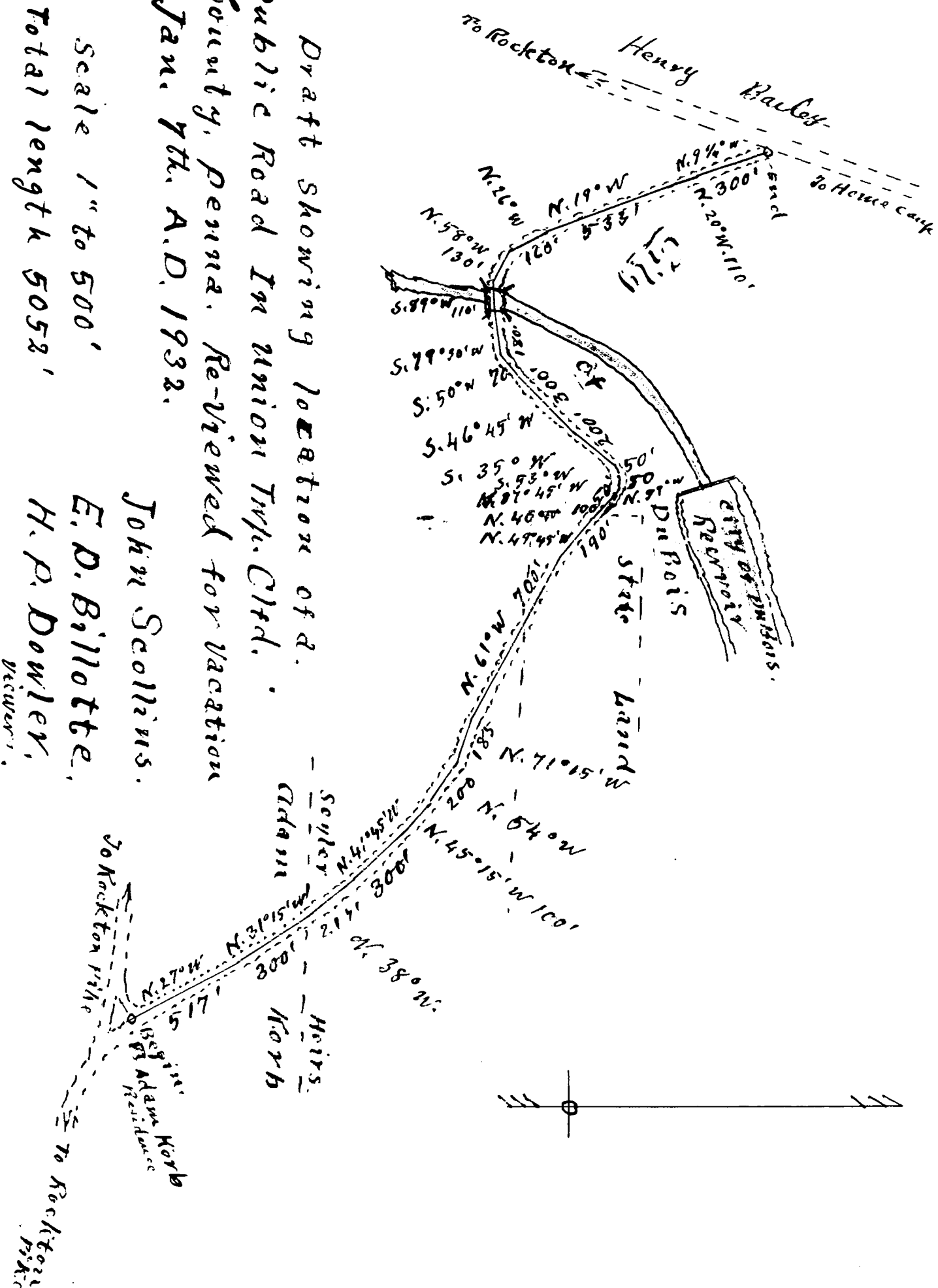

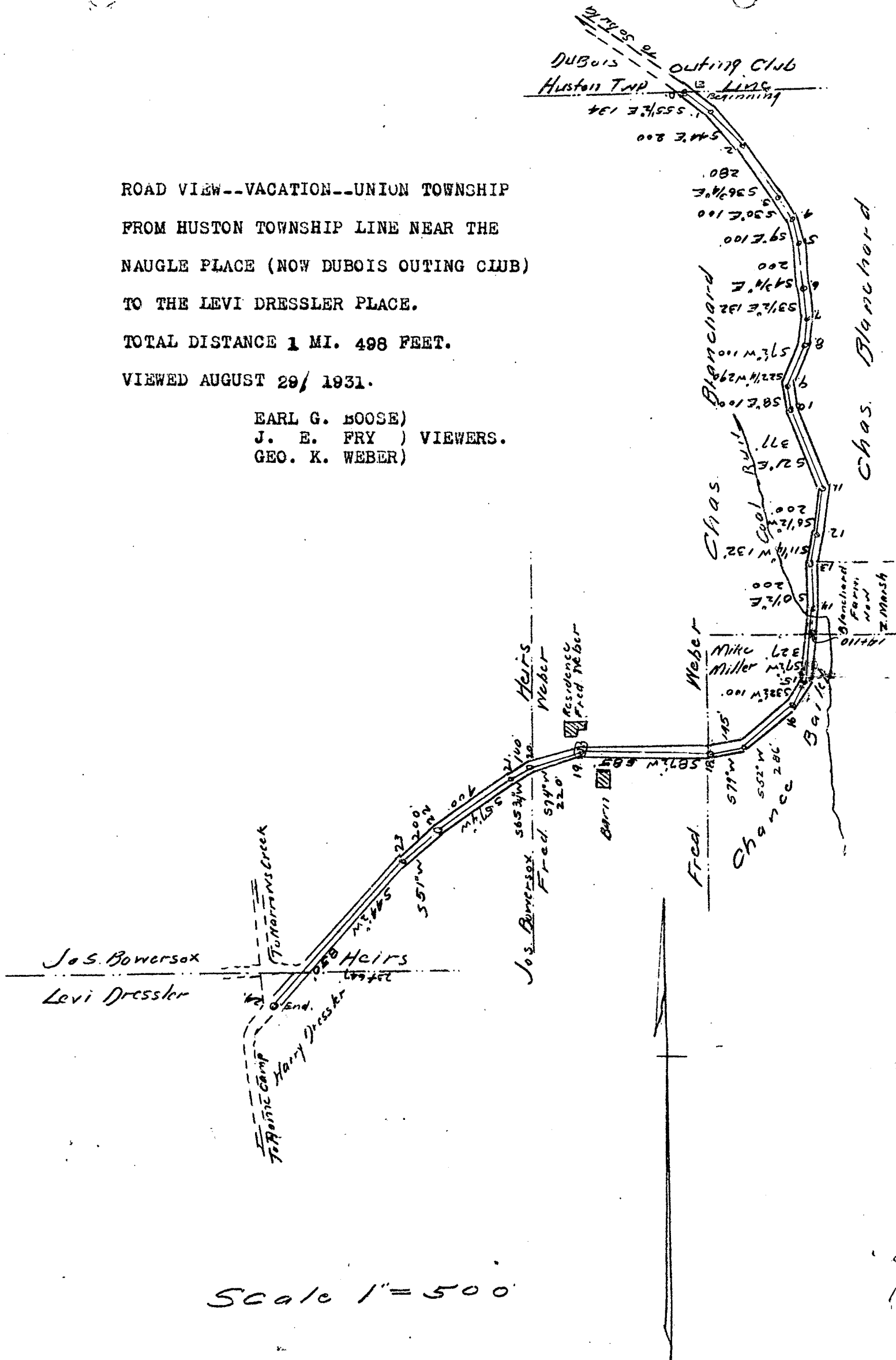

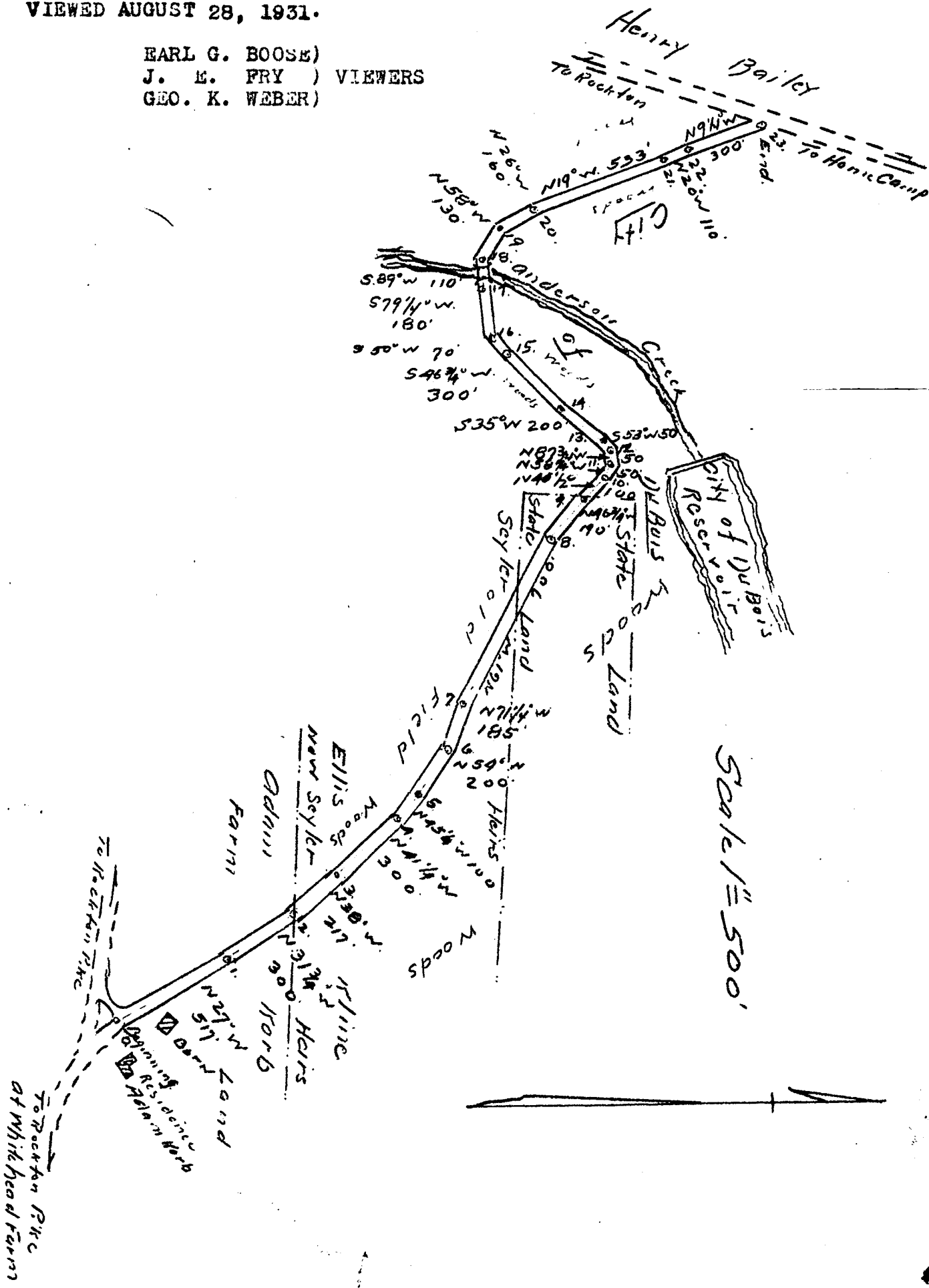
