To the Honorable A. R. Chase, President Judge of said Court:

- 1 - Your Petitioners are taxpayers of Burnside Township and they aver that there is a public road in the Township of Burnside which extends from a point at or about the McGee School House on the road leading from Glen Campbell to Patchinville, to a point at the foot of the hill near the line of Andy Russell, which is of little, or no, use to the Citizens of said Township or the traveling public and the expense necessary to keep and maintain this road should be applied on other roads which are necessary for use of the traveling public.
- 2 - The road herein sought to be vacated, is as follows: Beginning at a point at the Southwest corner of John McGee's farm to Andy Russell's line, being a portion of the road leading from the McGee School House to Stiffletown, said road is approximate one and one-half miles in length.
- 3 - There are no homes, business establishments, school houses or other structures of any nature or description along the portion of road herein sought to be vacated.

WHEREFORE, your Petitioners pray that your Honorable Court will take such prompt action as in your discretion may be necessary to cause this section of road to be vacated.

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE PEACE, IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD, PA.

We, the undersigned Viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of the view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County, and the Board of Supervisors

of the Township of **Burnside**, and that **three** notices thereof were posted along the route of the said road to be vacated, that the said view would be held on the

14th day of **November**, A. D. 19**33**, and that the public hearing, as required by the Act of Assembly, and the Rules of Court, would be held in the ~~Arbitration~~ Room in the Court House, in Clearfield,

Pa., on the **17th** day of **November** A. D., 19**33**, at **10** o'clock A. M., and that said Viewers, appointed by the said order, viewed the road desired to be vacated, and that there were present at the view **Jos. Nisewanger, Clark Beck and J. L. Byers, Supervisors of Burnside Township; Doyle Nisewanger, Ralph Beck, Charles Byers, J. O. Clark and R. V. Maine, Esq., Attorney for petitioners;**

parties interested, either in favor of or against vacating said road. And that the aforesaid hearing was held in the ~~Arbitration~~ Room in the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the **17th** day of **November**,

A. D. 19**33**, when the parties interested in the said road were in attendance: **F. G. Smith and R. V. Maine, Esqs., for petitioners; Jos. R. Nisewanger and Clark Beck, Supervisors of Burnside Township; H. W. Gardner, J. O. Clark and Aaron Clark, witnesses. Jos. R. Nisewanger, Clark Beck, H. W. Gardner, J. O. Clark and Aaron Clark, sworn, examined and cross-examined by Counsel and your Board.**

And that after the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned Viewers do agree that said road has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome, to wit: Beginning at a point at the southwest corner of John McGee's farm, at or near the site of the McGees school house on the road leading from Glen Campbell to Patchinville: thence along the Jos. By the Honorable ~~Singleton Beck~~, President Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of ~~sixty~~ Supervisors ~~inhabitants~~ of the Township of Burnside, in the County aforesaid setting forth that a road is unnecessary to the citizens of Burnside Township or to the traveling public. Beginning at a point at the southwest corner of John Magee's farm to Andy Russells line, being a portion of the road leading from McGees School House to Stiffertown. Said road is approximately one and one half miles in length.

and, therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and vacate said road between the points mentioned, whereupon the said Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers: John Scollins, Esq, Harry Reese and

Jack Michaels, who have been duly appointed by the said Court on the County Board of Viewers, and filed their oaths of office in the office of the Court of Common Pleas of the County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through which said road passes.

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft, or plot, aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.

We further find that the aforesaid road serves no public use; there are no residents along the route thereof; no public schools or churches served thereby. That the Township of Burnside is in debt to the limit of its borrowing capacity; and no work has been done on this road for a period of some two years; and as a result of wash-outs and growth of under-brush, it is not over 12 feet in width, at divers places; and parts of it with precipitous grade of 10%, making it dangerous for public travel. Approximately one-half mile of said road is over low, marshy land with insufficient drainage.

We further find that the residents living at the extremities thereof are served by good, well kept roads; that the aforesaid road has long been discontinued as a Mail Route; and that there are at least 46.4 miles of dirt roads in said Township to repair and maintain, and that the expense of maintaining said roads made necessary by additional vehicular traffic, necessitates the vacation of roads that are useless and serve no public necessity: your Board therefore recommends the vacation of the aforesaid described road; and files herewith petitions of resident taxpayers presented at the hearing before your Board, praying said vacation.

and that a plan, or draft, of said road to be vacated showing the courses and distances, and over whose property the said road passes, is hereto attached and made a part hereof.

The undersigned Viewers further report that they endeavored to procure from all parties affected by the vacation of said road, or over whose properties said road passes, or in any way damaged by the vacating of said road, a release in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from the vacation thereof, and that they procured such release from: No damages claimed, or assessed.

And that the following persons having, in the opinion of the Viewers, been damaged by the vacation of said road, and having refused to release the damages to which they may be respectively entitled to by reason of the vacation, and closing up of the said road, we, the undersigned Viewers, after having considered the advantages to be derived to them, do assess them damages and make report thereof, as follows:



To the Honorable A. R. Chase, President Judge of said Court:

The petition of the supervisors of Burnside Township respectfully represents:

1. Your petitioners are the supervisors of Burnside Township, and they aver that they have had to repair and maintain a great number of miles of road, and by reason of the constantly decreasing returns from taxes received, and the increased care required on said roads due to additional vehicular traffic, it is desirable that all roads not necessary to the traveling public be vacated.

2. There is a ^{public} road in the Township of Burnside which extends from a point at or about McGees school house on the road leading from Glen Campbell to Patchinville to a point at the foot of the hill near the ~~residence of Douglass~~ ^{line of Andy Russell}, which is of little use to the citizens of said township or the traveling public, and the expense to keep and maintain the same should be applied on the more travelled roads.


