To the Honorable A. R. Chase, President Judge of said Court:

The petition of the undersigned, inhabitants of the Township of Gulich, in the County of Clearfield, respectfully represents:

1.- That by proceedings had to No. 1, May Sessions, 1930, the Board of Viewers in their report filed in your Honorable Court, April 12, 1930, recommended the laying out of a public road, beginning at the intersection of the proposed road with the Tyrone-Ginter Pike (now an Improved Highway) and thence following the several courses and distances therein described, through the Village of Almaden, and ending in the Township Road leading from Ramey to Smith Mill, via Fernwood, at the property of Steve Balen.

2.- That exceptions were filed to the confirmation of said Viewers' Report, alleging indefiniteness in the termini of said proposed road, and that the Board failed to take into consideration the question of damages inflicted upon the properties of certain individuals through whose land the proposed road was to be laid out; and on June 30th, 1930 your Honorable Court in an opinion filed, sustained the exceptions and refused confirmation of the Viewers' Report.

3.- That your petitioners allege that the necessity for a public road still exists and that they labor under great inconvenience by reason of the fact that they have no public cut-let; and that a slight divergence from the plan as laid out by the original Board of View may be made without incurring excessive damage to properties, or inconvenience to your petitioners.

WHEREFORE, your petitioners pray your Honorable Court to appoint a Board of Viewers, to review the said Road and properties adjacent, and make report to the Court, in accordance with the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided.
