In re: Vacation of Mill Road : Answer of Users and Taxpayers  
in Chest Township :  
:

We the taxpayers in Chest Township and users of the Mill Road in Chest Township contend that the road is neither useless, nor inconvenient, nor burdensome. The reasons for our contentions are set out more fully herewith:

1. It is not useless. It is estimated that there are over forty users of the bridge, twenty of which are daily users including a milk delivery truck. See exhibit A.

2. It is not inconvenient. Users of this road from the New Washington district traveling toward Chest Township or users from Chest Township traveling toward New Washington find this road a very convenient short-cut as it is but one half as long as the next shortest route, that being the one through Newburg Borough.

3. It is not burdensome. If this road were to be vacated it would be necessary to send the children who live South of Chest Creek to the Newburg Borough school or furnish them with transportation to carry them out of Chest Township into Newburg Borough and then back into Chest Township to their school. If they were to attend the school in Newburg Borough the tuition charge would be \$ 18.00 per pupil. If

the township furnishes transportation the estimated cost is \$ 50.00 per month for eight months. In either case the vacating of this road would not lighten the burden on the taxpayers but will rather increase the burden.

WHEREFORE we the taxpayers of Chest Township and users of the Mill Road in Chest Township ask that the petition to vacate the Mill road be refused.

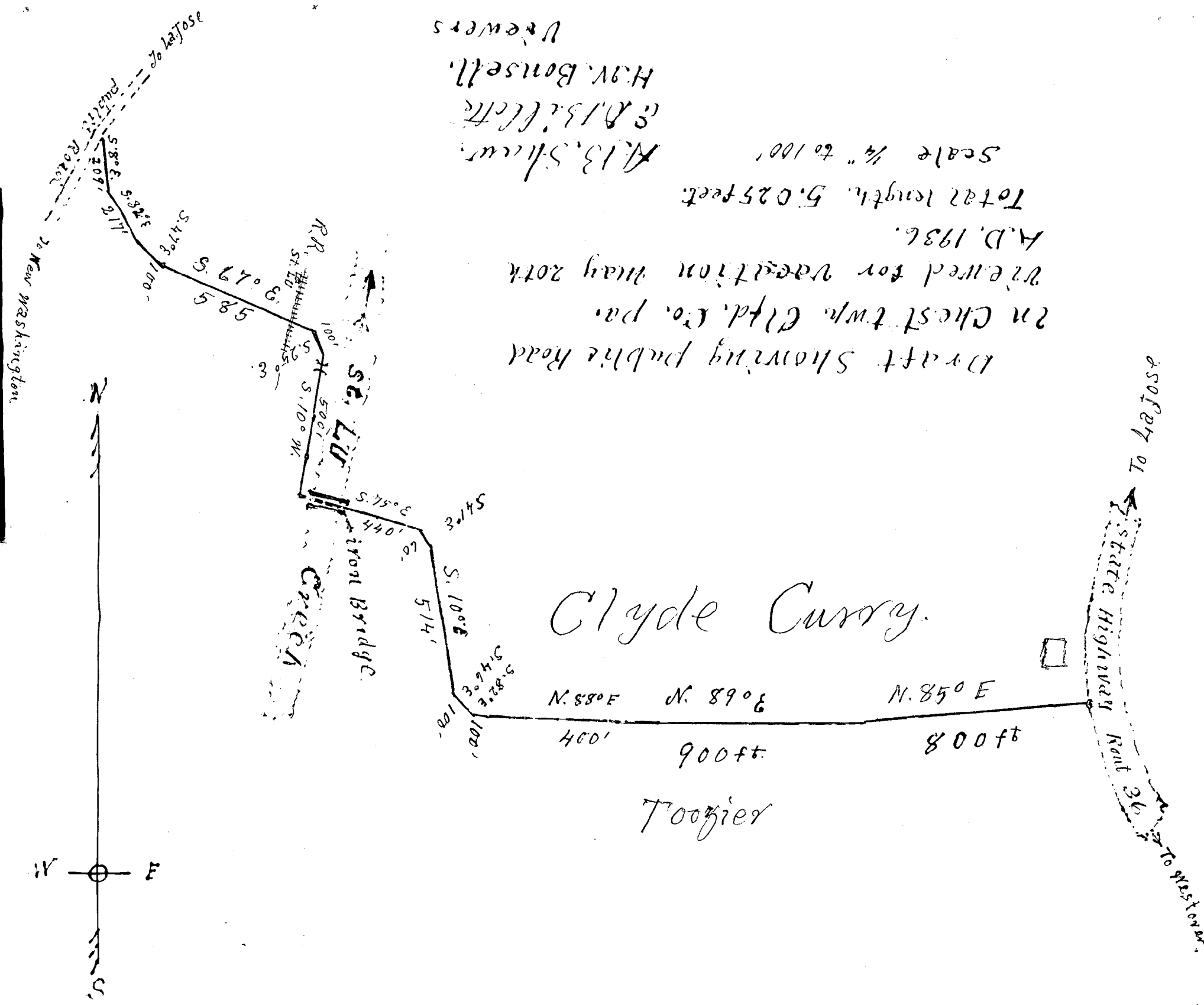

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE PEACE, IN AND FOR THE  
COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD, PA.

We, the undersigned Viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of the view and of the hearing day, was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County, and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Chest , and that notices thereof were posted along the route of the said road to be vacated, that the said view would be held on the

20th day of May , A. D. 1936, and that the public hearing, as required by the Act of Assembly, and the Rules of Court, would be held in the ~~Arbitration Room~~ <sup>Law Library</sup> in the Court House, in Clearfield,

Pa., on the 22nd day of May A. D., 1936, at 10:30 o'clock AM., and that said Viewers, appointed by the said order, viewed the road desired to be vacated, and that there were present at the view J.S. McFadden, Clair Westover, C.I. Raney and L.U. Guthrie.

parties interested, either in favor of or against vacating said road. And that the aforesaid hearing was held in the ~~Arbitration Room~~ <sup>Grand Jury Room</sup> in the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 22nd day of May ,

A. D. 1936 , when the parties interested in the said road were in attendance: John L. Urey Esq., Attorney for Chest Township Road Dist., Frank G. Smith Esq. of the firm of Liveright and Smith, solicitors for Clearfield County Pa., Glen Thompson Esq., representing those opposed to the vacation of said road, together with the following witnesses, Clair Westover, School Director for Chest Township, and L. U. Guthrie.

And that after the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned Viewers do agree that said road has not , become useless, inconvenient and burdensome as stated by the petition of the Supervisors of Chest Township. After viewing said road and also taking into consideration the testimony offered at the hearing, it would appear that the road in question, while not traveled extensively by the traveling public, it does serve a valuable purpose, and during certain seasons of the year is used as an outlet when other roads in that vicinity are impassable and therefore precludes a finding that said road is useless, inconvenient and burdensome. Your undersigned viewers are of the opinion that the cost of maintaining said road has not been burdensome or costly to the tax payers of Chest Township and it was further noted on the date of said view that the road was in a reasonably good state of repair, including the County Bridge on said road which traverses Chest Creek. Among the papers filed in this proceeding your undersigned viewers noted a remonstrance against the vacation of this road which seems to be signed by some of the largest tax payers of Chest Township. The vacation is also protested by the Chest Township School District as the vacation of this road would create an additional burden on said School District by requiring transportation or the payment of tuition at the Newberg



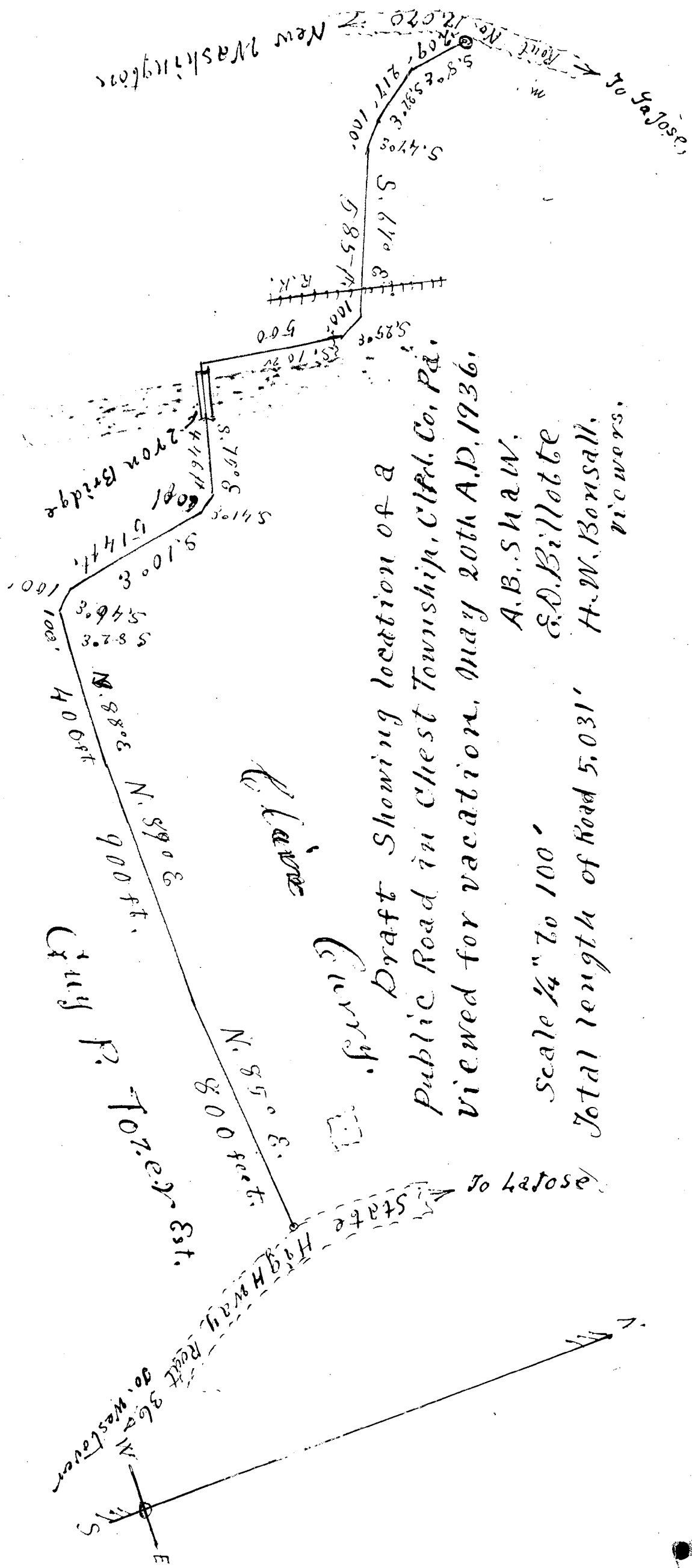

Bonsall who have been duly appointed by the said Court on the County Board of Viewers, and filed their oaths of office in the office of the Court of Common Pleas of the County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through which said road passes.

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft, or plot, aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.

In view of the aforementioned facts your undersigned viewers recommend that said township road be maintained as a public highway for the traveling public as heretofore.





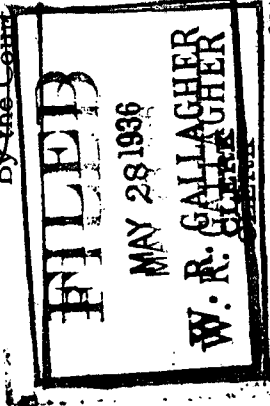

1. That your Petitioners are the Supervisors of Chest Township, and they aver that by reason of the constantly decreasing returns from taxes and the increased care required on the public roads of said Township due to additional vehicular traffic, it is desired that all roads not necessary for the use of the traveling public be vacated.

2. That a public road in said Township of Chest extends from a point in Route 17,070, leading from LaJose to New Washington, where the line between the Miller Hillard property and the property of the Tombs' Estate crosses said Route No. 17,070, near the J.
