The Petition of the Road Supervisors of Lawrence  
Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania respectfully represent.

1. That your petitioners desire to accept and adopt  
as township highways and streets; various streets which were  
dedicated as such by Hyde Brothers on the plot of Steel Plant  
Addition to Clearfield, Pennsylvania, recorded on September 16th,  
1902 in the office of the Recorder of Deeds in Clearfield County,  
Pennsylvania in Miscellaneous Book Volume S, page 515.

2. That your petitioners at a special meeting on  
May 22nd, 1936 adopted and approved a resolution accepting the  
following streets on the plot of Steel Plant Addition to Clear-  
field, Pennsylvania, as Township highways and streets:

ONE. Susquhanna Avenue-50 feet wide.

TWO. Lawrence Avenue-60 feet wide.

THREE. Clarendon Avenue-60 feet wide.

FOUR. Powell Avenue-60 feet wide.

FIVE. Robinson Avenue-60 feet wide.

SIX. Hall Street from Washington Avenue to Lawrence  
Avenue-60 feet wide.

SEVEN. Hoover Street from Susquhanna Avenue to  
Clarendon Avenue-60 feet wide.

EIGHT. Graham Street from Susquhanna Avenue to Robinson Avenue-60 feet wide.

NINE. Lawhead Street from Washington to Robinson Avenue-50 feet wide.

3. That a copy of said resolution is attached hereto and made a part of this petition.

4. That said adoption and acceptance of said streets is in accordance with the Act of Assembly of May 1st, 1933 P. L. 103 as amended by the Act of July 18th, 1935 P. L. 1308.

Wherefore your petitioners respectfully pray that your Honorable Court will approve the adoption and acceptance of said described streets on the plot of Steel Plant Addition to Clearfield, Pennsylvania, as Township Highways and Streets.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED: That the Road Supervisors of Lawrence Township accept and adopt as Township highways and streets the following streets which were dedicated as such by Hyde Bros. on the plot of Steel Plant Addition to Clearfield , Pennsylvania, recorded in the office of the Recorder of Deeds in Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, in miscellaneous Book Volume S page 515.

ONE - Susquhanna Avenue - 50'

TWO - Lawrence Avenue 60'

THREE\* - Clarendon Avenue 60'

FOUR - Powell Avenue - 60'

FIVE - Robinson Avenue 60'

SIX - Hall street from Washington Avenue to Lawrence Avenue. 60'

SEVEN - Hoover Street from Susquhanna Avenue to Clarendon Avenue. 60'

EIGHT - Graham Street from Susquhanna Avenue to Robinson Avenue. 60'

NINE - Lawhead Street from Washington to Robinson Avenue. 50'

Said Streets are to be maintained as Township Highways by the Road Supervisors of Lawrence Township.

To the Honorable W. Wallace Smith, President Judge of said Court:

The petition of the Road Supervisors of Lawrence Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, respectfully represents:

1. That on July 6, 1936, your petitioners filed a petition with your Honorable Court, asking that various streets, which were dedicated as such by Hyde Brothers on the plot of Steel Plant Addition to Clearfield, Pennsylvania; recorded on September 16, 1902 in the office of the Recorder of Deeds in Clearfield County, Pennsylvania in Miscellaneous Book Volume S, page 515; be accepted and adopted as township highways and streets.

2. That on July 6, 1936, your Honorable Court approved the adoption and acceptance of the aforementioned streets among which was one Lawrence Avenue, being sixty (60) feet wide.

3. Your petitioners aver that in said petition, they failed to state, both there and in the resolution, that said street was only to be accepted from the eastern edge of said plot to Hall Street.

4. That said Lawrence Avenue has never been opened beyond Hall Street.

5. That on September 3, 1938, a resolution was adopted and approved accepting Lawrence Avenue from the eastern edge of said plot to Hall Street, as a Township highway and street.

6. That a copy of said resolution is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Wherefore your petitioners respectfully pray that your Honorable Court will approve the adoption and acceptance of said described streets on the plot of Steel Plant Addition to Clearfield, Pennsylvania, as a Township Highway and Street,

RESOLUTION

Be it hereby resolved that on May 22, 1936, the Road Supervisors of Lawrence Township accepted and adopted as Township Highway and Street among various other streets, Lawrence Avenue, which was dedicated as such by Hyde Brothers. That in said Resolution the Supervisors failed to provide that said Lawrence Avenue was only to be opened from the eastern edge of said plot to Hall Street. Wherefore the Supervisors resolve, hereby, that said original resolution of May 22, 1936, be amended to read that Lawrence Avenue from the eastern edge of said plot to Hall Street be accepted and adopted as a Township Highway.


