RETURN OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE PEACE, IN AND FOR THE
COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD, PA.

We, the undersigned Viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of the view and of the hearing day, was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County, and the Board of Supervisors

of the Township of Chest, and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of ^{each} the said road to be vacated, that the said view would be held on the

27th. day of March, 1937, and that the public hearing, as required by the Act of Assembly, and the Rules of Court, would be held in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield,

Pa., on the 30th day of March, 1937, at 9.30 o'clock A. M., and that said Viewers, appointed by the said order, viewed the road desired to be vacated, and that there were present at the view also Charles Michaels, one of the Supervisors of Chest Township and Milton Westover, a citizen of Westover Borough,.....

parties interested, either in favor of or against vacating said road. And that the aforesaid hearing was held No. 1 Court in the Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 30th day of March, 1937, when the parties interested in the said road were in attendance: that is, Charles Michaels and Clyde McGarvey, of the Supervisors of Chest Township, no other persons appearing as parties in interest appearing.

And that after the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned Viewers do agree that said roads and sections of road road has, become useless, inconvenient and burdensome for the reason that the reconstruction of State Highway No. 36 has provided an improved road for the traveling public adjacent to and in most cases, closely parallel to the roads and sections of road described in the petition and the notices. This conclusion being strengthened by the absence from the hearing of any one opposing the vacation of the said roads and sections of road mentioned.

The description of each of the roads or sections of road recommended to be vacated is not here given in detail, but in lieu thereof, reference is made to the blue print, upon which is marked the roads or section of the said roads and sections of roads sought to be vacated, in red, which is attached to the petition, and also the said roads and sections of roads are by curves and angles fully shown on the map prepared by Harry Reese, one of the viewers, which map is also attached hereunto, as a part of this Report.

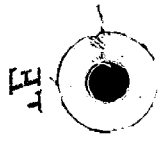
point from and among the County Board of Viewers E. G. Boose, Esq., Harry E. Reese,
and T. C. McGarvey who have been duly appointed by the said Court on the

County Board of Viewers, and filed their oaths of office in the office of the Court of Common Pleas of the
County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appoint-
ment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after
having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they
shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report
thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether
there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together
with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through
which said road passes.

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from
the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating
of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the
owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers
shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from
the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner trans-
mit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft, or plot, aforesaid. In which said reports they
shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given
of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.

In the matter of damages sustained by any one by reason of the vacation of the said roads and sections of road which are hereby recommended for vacation, the Viewers, are of the opinion that the vacations, if approved by the Court, will not be an element of damage to any one. No one in person or by counsel appeared at the hearing to demand damage and the conclusion of the Viewers consequently was that no one in interest intended to claim damage. The Viewers were accordingly relieved from the duty of awarding damage or asking waivers, or releases.

The undersigned Viewers further report that they endeavored to procure from all parties affected by the vacation of said road, or over whose properties said road passes, or in any way damaged by the vacating of said road, a release in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from the vacation thereof, and that they procured such release from:-
