RETURN OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, be leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Bigler and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 12th day of August A. D. 1928, and the hearing to be held in the ^{Grand Jury} ~~Assessment~~ Room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 15th day of August, 1928, at 10 o'clock A.M. That the three viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view George Trugon, Wasko Russin, Michael Russin, Mike Stanko, Mike Harp, Mike Washek, Peter Washek, Robert Greenaway, Wasko Yeburnetsky, Jr., and Walter Holgas; as well as Raymond Siford, Supervisor of Bigler Township, ^{Grand Jury} ~~Assessment~~ Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 15th day of August A. D. 1928, when the following appearances were noted: George Trugon, Wasko Yeburnetsky and Walter Holgas, petitioners; Raymond Siford and William Hensal, Supervisors of Bigler Township: all of whom were sworn, examined and cross-examined by your Board.

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is no occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is not necessary for a public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for public use the following described road, to wit Beginning at a point at the Township road near the Bucher School House, thence over lands of the Middle Pennsylvania Coal Corporation the following courses and distances, to wit: North 43 degrees 30 minutes East one hundred feet to a post; thence North 68 degrees 30 minutes East seven hundred feet to a post; thence South 89 degrees East five hundred feet to a post; thence South 79 degrees East three hundred feet to a post; thence South 81 degrees East three hundred feet to a post; thence South 53 degrees East five hundred and sixty feet to a post; thence South 45 degrees 30 minutes East seven hundred and fourteen feet to a post; thence South 93 degrees East two hundred and eighty-five feet to a post; thence South 55 degrees East four hundred feet to a post; thence South 49 degrees 30 minutes East three hundred and eighteen feet to a post; thence South 40 degrees East five hundred and sixty feet to a post; thence South 43 degrees East five hundred and seventy-five feet to a post; thence South 32 degrees 30 minutes East nine hundred and seventy-five feet to a post; thence South 32 degrees 30 minutes East five hundred feet to a post; and thence South 31 degrees 30 minutes East six hundred feet, and ending in the public road leading from Madera to Morgan Run.

We further find as facts: that the proposed road passes over lanes and ways opened and used as out-lets to the property owners living in the communities of "Eureka 18" and "Harp Hollow" served thereby, as well as wood-lands of the Middle Penna. Coal

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 5th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred thirty-eight

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Bigler in said County, setting forth that viewers be appointed to lay out a road--beginning at a point at a Township road near the Bucher School house in Bigler Township to a Township road near the residence of Lewis Tubo. This said last named ~~xxx~~ Township road is a road leading from Madera to Morgan Run.

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers John Scollins, Esq., E. D. Billotte and T. C. McGarvey

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgement, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing

Corporation, which has released all claims to damages by reason of the opening of the proposed public road and the right-of-way necessary therefor; there are 17 families living on or nearby said proposed road, and to be accommodated thereby, as well as a public Play-ground and Dance Pavilion, known as "18-Park" and Ball-ground.

We find that the present roads are impassable in Winter and Spring Seasons for vehicular traffic, and one of the very few communities not served by public roads.

The Supervisors contend that the annual road-tax return from that part of the Township is only some \$20.00, and that the Township is unable to build the road without Federal Assistance; and the petitioners ask that the proposed road be put on the Map as a township-road and they would be willing to wait until a Project can be obtained from W.P.A.

Wherefore, your Board concludes that the said road, so as aforesaid laid out, is necessary for a public road;

and that a plan or draft of said road showing courses and distances and the properties affected is hereto attached and made a part hereof, said road being at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, excepting

when it was not practical to preserve it within that limit.

The undersigned further report that they endeavored to procure from all the owners of the land over which the said road passes releases in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from opening the same, and that they procured such releases from The Middle Pennsylvania Coal Corporation.

the following persons having refused to release the damages to which they respectfully may be entitled by reason of the location and opening of the said road, we, the undersigned viewers, after having considered the advantages to be derived to them, do assess them damages and make report thereof as follows: No damages claimed or assessed.

and we herewith return releases obtained and copy of the notices.

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.
Also, viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.
Viewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.
N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

RELEASE OF DAMAGES


