Petition to vacation of abandoned roads in Decatur Township

TO THE HON. W. WALLACE SMITH, President Judge of said Court:

The petition of the Supervisors of the Township of Decatur,
respectfully represents:

(1). That under date of October 26, 1938, Roy E. Brownmiller,
Secretary of Highways, advised your petitioners that due to re-
location of State Highway Route 17047, that the highway had been
relocated from a point at 215~~4~~29 to station 232~~4~~00, a distance of
1680 feet or .3182 miles, and in substitution therefore a relocat-
ed road constructed from present point 219~~4~~00 to point 235~~4~~50 and
from thence on to 241~~4~~50, being along the boundary line between
Woodward and Decatur Township.

(2). That the new portion of said road parallels the old
route at a distance of not more than twenty-five or thirty feet
therefrom, and because of cuts and fills, the portion of the old
highway is completely useless and should be abandoned as being of
no benefit to Decatur Township and constituting a danger to anyone
who should possibly try to travel thereon.

(3). In accordance with the provisions of Section 21 of the
Act of June 13, 1836 as amended April 22, 1937, P.L. 393, your
petitioners request your Honorable Court to direct the vacation of
said abandoned portion of said highway Route 17047 according to
law; and they will ever pray.

NOW, November 21, A.D. 1938, the within petition having been read and considered and it appearing that there are no adverse rights effected by the vacation of said Highway, which runs closely parallel to the Highway as re-located, and no property lies between the old Highway and the Highway as re-located; in accordance with the right set forth in the Amendment of April 22, 1937, Pamphlet Laws 393, do hereby declare vacated that portion of the former State Highway existing in the Township of Decatur, begining from point 215 $\frac{1}{2}$ 9 on the old highway, new station 219 $\frac{1}{2}$ 00, thence along the line of the former state highway to a point approximately at station 241 $\frac{1}{2}$ 50; said road being rendered unnecessary because of the re-location of the said highway, and the land to revert to the former owners thereof.
