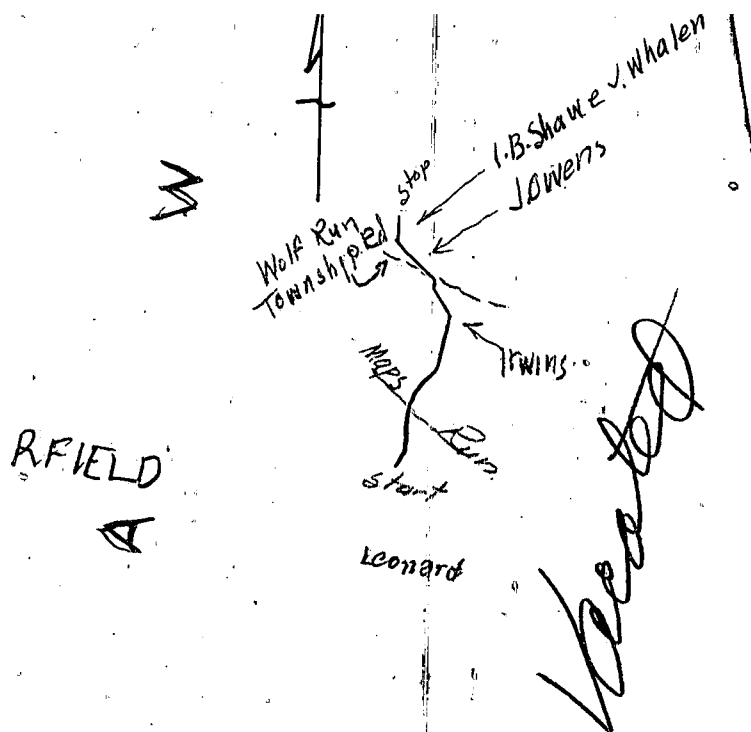

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the 27 day of

June A. D., 1866 before the Judges of the said Court upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Lawrence in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway to lead from the river at or

near Lawrence bridge, to intersect the Indian road, near Morris Mill race, in Lawrence of

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint John A. Beattie, Joseph Stevens & Henry Davis

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

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To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the
County of Clearfield.

The undersigned viewers appointed by the Order of Court hereto attached, to view and lay out the road therein mentioned.

See Report. That they gave due and timely notice of said view by advertisements put up ten days before, and after being duly affirmed, proceeded to lay out the following road. Beginning at the River road immediately below the mouth of Mapes Run, thence North forty degrees East, eighteen perches, thence North fourteen degrees East, twenty perches, thence North two and one half degrees West, forty eight perches, thence North seventeen and one half degrees East, eighteen perches, thence North forty one degrees East, ten perches, thence North twenty two degrees East, seven perches, thence North twenty eight degrees East, ten perches, thence North forty nine degrees East, twenty eight perches, thence North fifty two degrees East, ten perches, North thirty six degrees East, six perches, thence North twenty three degrees East, nineteen perches, thence North ten degrees East, eighty eight perches, thence North thirty two and one half degrees West, eighty four perches, thence North nineteen and one half degrees East, ten perches, to the Wolf Run Township road, then by the Wolf Run road, North fifty degrees West, eighty perches, thence North forty three degrees West, thirty nine perches, thence North two degrees East, thirty nine perches, to intersect the Sick Run road, 7 perches, east of the Goshen Road, leading past the house of Morris Wallace to Clearfield, and they recommend the said road for Private use.
