Petition for Road View in WOODWARD

TOWNSHIP

Versus

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the Ninth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred Thirty-eight.

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Woodward in said County, setting forth that they suffer great inconvenience for want of a public road in the Village of Woodward, Township of Woodward, County of Clearfield and State of Pennsylvania.

That said Road should begin at a point on the old State Road, Route No. 153, near the residence of John McGhee, in the Township of Woodward, aforesaid, and extend to a point at the corner of Hemlock Street and an unnamed Alley in the Village of Woodward, said Township, at or near the residence of Benjamin Majesky.

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers John Scollins, Esq.,

E. D. Billotte, and H. W. Bonsall

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgement, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing.

RETURN OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, be leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Woodward and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 25th day of August A. D. 1938, and the hearing to be held in the ~~Adjudication~~ Room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 29th day of August, 1938, at 10 o'clock A. M. That the three viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view ~~and James Varger, Supervisors of Woodward Twp., with their Atty., J. Howard Smith, Esq.; John Dombrosky, John McGhee, Thomas Gmerek, Mike Dombrosky, Walter Sterneitsky, Albert Gmerek, Joe Gmerek, Mike Tomko, Frank Laskowsky, John Krupinsky, John Laskowsky, Costyack Laskowsky, John Gavlak, Paul Gavlak, Steve Horchak, et al.~~ Ashley Martin, John McDermott parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the ~~Adjudication~~ Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 29th day of August A. D. 1938, when the following appearances were noted: J. Howard Smith, Esq., Atty. for Woodward Township Board of Supervisors; John P. McDermott, Supervisor, sworn, examined, and cross-examined by Counsel and your Board.

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is no occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is not necessary for a public road: ~~And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in the manner described the best and most direct route to private property and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do now fix the following described road, to wit~~ Beginning at a point on the old State Road, Route No. 153, near the residence of John McGhee (said point being South 48 degrees West 1201 feet plus 125 feet from the Improved Highway No. 353 leading from Houtzdale to Ginter): thence South 48 degrees West nine hundred and seventy-five feet to a point at the corner of Hemlock Street and an unnamed Alley in the Village of Woodward.

The proposed road would accomodate the following families: John McGhee, Mike Stine, Tony Sterneitsky, Valentine Barto, Mike Banas, Vincent Bezilla, Mike Pavlansky, Benj. Miasky, but the right-of-way being only 20 feet in width, to make it a public road of lawful width would require the property owners to move their fences back, and the hearing was adjourned to obtain releases and waiver of damages from property owners fronting thereon, until September 22nd, 1938 at 10 o'clock A.M.

And now, September 22nd, 1938 at the appointed time for the adjourned hearing hereon, it appearing that at a public meeting held September 18, 1938, at the Whiteside school-house, it was unanimously voted by the property-owners not to waive damages for the properties required for the proposed road; that the porposed road would be too close to the school-building; that it would not be in the public interest to build the road at this time: Your Board finds that the proposed road is unnecessary as a public road, and that the same would be useless, inconvenient and burdensome for the Township to maintain.

and that a plan or draft of said road showing courses and distances and the properties affected is hereto attached and made a part hereof, ~~said road being at an elevation not exceeding five
degrees~~

when it was not practical to preserve it with pickling.

The undersigned further report that they endeavored to procure from all the owners of the land over which the said road passes releases in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from opening the same, and that they procured such releases from none of the property owners affected;

the following persons having refused to release the damages to which they respectfully may be entitled by reason of the location and opening of the said road, we, the undersigned viewers, after having considered the advantages to be derived to them, do assess them damages and make report thereof as follows: Your Board recommends that the petition be dismissed.

and we herewith return releases obtained and copy of the notices.



N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.


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
