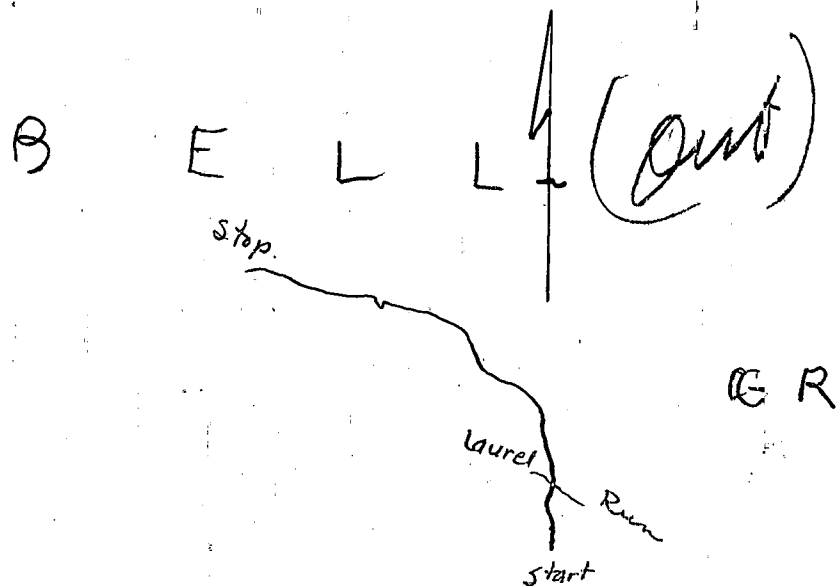

The petition of divers inhabitants of the
Township of Bell in said County humbly
sheweth; That a road has been
lately laid out by order of Court, from
the mouth of Laurel Run on the Susquehanna
river, to intersect a road leading from Oad
Sabins Saw-mill in Bell Township to Runtys
Grist Mill in Brady Township on lands of
Wm. Mahaffey in Bell Township, which road
if confirmed by the Court, will be very
injurious to your petitioners and burthensome
to the inhabitants of the Township through
which the same runs. Your petitioners
therefore pray your honours not to confirm
said road. — And they will pray &c.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the 26 day of *September* A. D. 1866 before the Judges of the said Court upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of *Beck* in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway to lead from *the Public road*

at or near the mouth of Sawmill run
to intersect the road laid out from
Dr. Hays Sawmill in Beck Tp. to

Jacob Hantz mill in Brady Tp.
and to intersect said Road at or
near McShaffers Cherry in Beck Tp.

Report as to Sawmills.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Thomas M. Moore, Daniel Hays & Sampson Beck

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

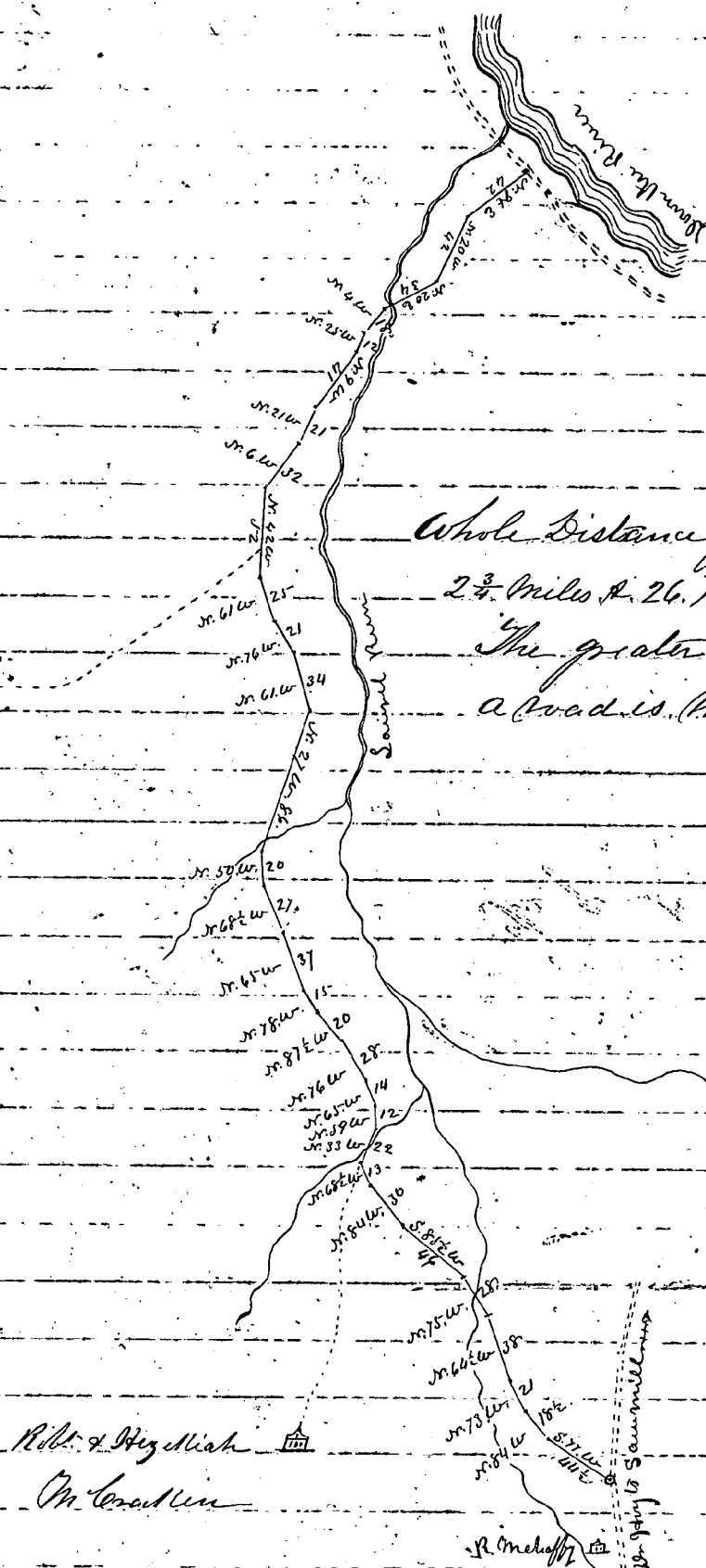

of the same and no damage having resulted to any
one by reason of the passing of said road we have
