: No. 5 February Sessions 1940
in Decatur Township. :

To the Honorable W. Wallace Smith, President Judge of said Court:

The Petition of the Supervisors of Decatur Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, respectfully represents:

(1). That for sometime in the past there has existed in the Township of Decatur a highway designated as Highway Route 662, beginning at the property of Mrs. Ella McGinty, then through the properties of Charles Winters, George Ashworth, and George McNeish to or near the mine of William Burton, and which properties your Petitioners are advised have been returned and sold to the County of Clearfield for non-payment of taxes.

(2). That the portion of the road as designated traverses over ground that is subject to caves by reason of the mining and removal of the minerals beneath the surface of said mine; has three sharp and hazardous curves, and your Petitioners are desirous of relocating approximately eleven hundred (1100) feet to twelve hundred (1200) feet of said road over and through the same properties, the new location of which will not be subject to the same hazards as attend the former location.

(3). That a release of damages by those owning the properties over which said road would pass, or having a right of redemption therefore, is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

(4). That the section of road to be vacated begins at a point on the Township Road 17662 approximately six hundred forty-one (641) feet northwest of the intersection of said road with Township Route 17664; thence south sixty-three (63) degrees thirty (30) minutes west a distance of two hundred thirty-three (233) feet; thence north eighty-two (82) degrees no minutes west a distance of eleven hundred twenty-eight (1128) feet. The greater portion of

the last named distance being over ground subject to cave ins.

(5). The portion of the road sought to be supplied is in the portion of Decatur Township adjoining Osceola Borough, and known as Stump Town. Beginning at a point on Township Route 17662 approximately six hundred forty-one (641) feet from its intersection with Township Route 17664; thence north sixty-four (64) degrees west a distance of six hundred thirty-three and five-tenth (633.5) feet to a point; thence north eighty-nine (89) degrees west via nine (9) degrees thirty (30) minute curve a distance of five hundred and forty-seven (547) feet to a point; thence south sixty-four (64) degrees west one hundred seventy-four and five-tenths (174.5) feet to a point at the intersection with center of present Township Route 17662.

(6). That there is attached hereto a map showing the location of the road sought to be vacated and the portion of the road sought to be supplied, the road to be supplied being marked in red.

WHEREFORE, your Petitioners pray your Honorable Court that an Order be made authorizing and approving the relocation of said road by the vacation of a former portion, and supply of a new length of road as set forth herein.


