The petition of the undersigned, all of the Road Supervisors of the Township of Sandy, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, respectfully represents:

1. That on the 16th day of March 1943 they presented petition for road view for the vacation of two portions of abandoned highway in the Township of Sandy, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, as set forth therein.

2. That after filing and presenting said petition, the Highway Department of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, abandoned another piece of highway, being designated as the portion from a point at Station 384+15 to a point at Station 391+45, a distance of approximately 730 feet or approximately .1383 of a mile, which said abandoned portion of the highway is paralleled by the new improved surface and serves no purpose or convenience to the traveling public.

The petition of the undersigned, all of the Road Supervisors of the Township of Sandy, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, respectfully represents:

1. The State Highway Department of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in improving, relocating and otherwise extending the state highway system in the Township of Sandy, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, did, under the authority of the Acts of Assembly in such case made and provided, abandon and turn over to the Road District of Sandy Township, two certain pieces of highway, less than one mile each, as hereinafter described.

2. That the said portions of highway abandoned are paralleled by improved highway, do not serve the public, and are of no use or value, to the traveling public, but will be an expensive burden to the said Road District, and the abutting property owners thereon have no objection thereto.

3. Said two pieces of highway are described as follows: 72+20 861

The first thereof, beginning on Legislative Route 816 at Station 122+20 to the Brady Township line at Station 121 43, a distance of 4,923 feet.

which said stretch of highway has been abandoned by the State High-

way Department, and is paralleled by an improved route, known generally as U. S. Highway Route 322.

The second thereof, beginning on Legislative Route 402 at Station 112 74, to Station 128 15, a distance of about 1541 feet, and is what is properly known as U. S. Highway Route 255.

4. That both pieces of said highway are closely adjacent to the relocated and improved through highway and if left go, are apt to become dangerous to the traveling public, although the said abandoned pieces serve no useful purpose to any persons or property.

5. That the second portion of highway to be abandoned is entirely within the property limits of the Morningside Cemetery Association, and is desired by the said Association for purposes of landscaping and improvement of their grounds.

WHEREFORE, your petitioners respectfully pray your honorable Court to appoint Viewers to view the said highways and make an order of vacation of the same.





J. ~~M.~~ Fry who have been duly appointed by the said Court on the County Board of Viewers, and filed their oaths of office in the office of the Court of Common Pleas of the County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through which said road passes.

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft, or plot, aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.


