To the Honorable F. Cortez Bell,

President Judge of said Court:

The petition of the undersigned, inhabitants of the Township of Woodward, in said County of Clearfield, respectfully represents:

1. That your petitioners labor under great inconveniences for want of a public road or highway, leading from the residence of John Higgins situate along State Highway Route #53, in West Houtzdale, to the Woodward Township High School, and thence via a dedicated public street in the village of West Moshannon, ending in the public road leading from the village of West Moshannon aforesaid to "X-Keys, in said Township, approximately 5/10ths of a mile in length.

2. That the present existing roads and paths traversed in going to and from the improved roads to the said High School are unkept, muddy and impassable in winter and inclement weather; and dangerous for public travel by the children on foot, and motor vehicle travel.

Wherefore, your petitioners pray your Honorable Court to appoint a board of Viewers to view and lay out the same, according to law.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 12th day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and Forty-four

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Woodward

in said County, setting forth that petitioners labor under great inconveniences for want of a public road or highway, leading from the residence of John Higgins situate along State Highway Route #53, in West Houtzdale, to the Woodward Township High School, and thence via a dedicated public street in the village of West Moshannon, ending in the public road leading from the village of West Moshannon aforesaid to "X-Keys, in said Township, approximately 5/10th of a mile in length.

That the present existing roads and paths traversed in going to and from the improved roads to the said High School are unkept, muddy and impassable in winter and inclement weather; and dangerous for public travel by the children on foot, and motor vehicle travel. and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road

between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers A. B. Shaw,

Edward Pooler and Harry Reese

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgement, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing

RETURN OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, be leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Woodward and that Three notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 5th day of July A. D. 1924, and the hearing to be held in the ^{Grand Jury} ~~Arbitration~~ Room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 7th day of July, 1924, at 10:30 o'clock A. M. That Three viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view William Pooler and J. Edward Tompkins, supervisors of the Road District of the Township of Woodward, also R. W. Roundsley, one of the Petitioners.

parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the Arbitration Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 7th day of July A. D. 1924, when the following appearances were noted: John Scollins, Esquire, Attorney for the Petitioners, Percey Shuger, Edward Lloyd, Fritz Dahlin, R. W. Roundsley and William Pooler one of the Supervisors of Woodward Township.

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is _____ occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is _____ necessary for a Public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for Public use the following described road, to wit Beginning at a point on State Highway Route # 53 at or near the residence of John Higgins in the village of West Houtzdale, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania; thence along a Road leading to the Woodward Township High School, South 8 degrees West Three Hundred Sixty Nine Feet (369) to a stake; thence around the Woodward Township High School, over a hard surfaced road South 23 degrees East Two Hundred (200) feet to a stake; thence South 33 degrees West, One Hundred Forty One (141) feet to a stake thence North 86 degrees West One Hundred Fifty-Seven (157) feet to a stake; thence along a dedicated Road ~~South of~~ the Village of West Moshannon South 62 degrees 30 minutes West, One Thousand feet (1000) to a point where said Street or newly proposed Road intersects with Township Road Route # 652 in said Township of Woodward Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

The proposed Road is laid out over a Road ~~and~~ dedicated Street now serving as excess to and from the Woodward Township High and Grade School Buildings, and not heretofore accepted as a part of the general road system of the Road District of the Township of Woodward, which said dedicated Street and Road leading to the Woodward Township High and Grade School grounds are in the opinion of your undersigned Board of Viewers, necessary for the convenience of the traveling public and should be taken over and maintained at public expaese.

That approximately 700 pupils attend the Woodward Township High and Grade Schools both of which are located on the same sight and the present Street and/or Roads leading to said School sight become impassible by School Buses and Cars during parts of the School Term, due to lack of grading and improper drainage and as said Street and/or Road leading to the Woodward Township Schools, aforesaid are necessary for the convenience of the Pupils attending said schools as well as

for the traveling public, the same should be taken over and maintained at Public expense.

That the taking over of said dedicated Street and/or Road now leading to the Woodward Township High and Grade Schools Grounds, as a part of the general Road system of the Road District of the Township of Woodward, is agreed to the Supervisors of Woodward Township and according to the great number of Petitioners requesting the same, the newly proposed Road appears to be necessary for the convenience of the pupils attending said schools, as well as, for the accomodations and convenience of the traveling public, and your undersigned Board of Viewers recommend that said Street and/or Roads now leading to the Woodward Township High and Graded Schools, be taken over by the Supervisors of the Woodward Township Road District and maintained as a public Road.

and that a plan or draft of said road showing courses and distances and the properties affected is hereto attached and made a part hereof, said road being at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, excepting


when it was not practical to preserve it within that limit.


