Public Road in LAWRENCE TOWNSHIP

In Re: Petition for Public Road in the Township of Lawerence : No. 1 September S S, 1945

TO THE HONORABLE, F, CORTEZ BELL, PRESIDENT JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

The Petition of the undersigned inhabitants of the Township of Lawerence, County of Clearfield, respectfully represents:

1. That your petitioners labor under a great inconvenience for want of a public road leading from the Stage Highway, Route # 17038, at or near the village of Glen Richey in said Township, thence extending in an Easterly direction from said Highway via a private road or roads, a distance of approximately one-half mile and ending at the farm of Ed. Gill in said Township.

2. That the present existing private road or roads, being the only means of access to and from this area, become impassable during certain seasons of the year, and dangerous to public travel, and the upkeep thereof is too burdensome to property owners abutting along the same.

3. That your undersinged petitioners are of the opinion that a public road between the termnii mentioned heredinis esential and necessary for the convenience of the traveling public and should be constructed and maintained at public expense.

Wherefore your Petitioners pray your Honorable Court to appoint a Board of Viewers to view and lay out a public road with the termnii above described, according to law.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 20th day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and Forty-five

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Lawrence and Supervisors of Lawrence Township in said County, setting forth that they labor under a great inconvenience for want of a public road leading from the State Highway, Route #17038, at or near the village of Glen Richey in said Township, thence extending in an Easterly direction from said Highway via a private road or roads, a distance of approximately one-half mile and ending at the farm of Ed. Gill in said Township.

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers Leo R. Brockbank, Esq., Harry Reese and Benjamin Hughes

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgement, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing

RETURN OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, be leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Lawrence and that three (3) notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 22nd day of August 1924, and the hearing to be held in the ~~Examination Room~~ ^{Grand Jury Room}, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 23rd day of August, 1924, at 10:00 ^{Daylight Saving Time} o'clock A. M. That three (3) viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view we did not see anyone present at the view, but talked with Edward Gill at his premises at the Eastern end of said proposed road

parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the ~~Examination Room~~, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 23rd day of August 1924, when the following appearances were noted: A. B. Shaw, Esq., representing petitioners; also Edward Gill, Albert B. Johnson and John W. Brady, petitioners.

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is NO occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is NOT necessary for a Public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for use the following described road, to wit
Beginning

The testimony showed that the proposed road is at present a private road commencing at a point on State Highway Route No. 17038 in the village of Glen Ritchey in Lawrence Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, at or near the company store, and thence running in an Easterly direction across a small stream and up the hill to the premises of Edward Gill, where it comes to a dead end. The distance is about eight hundred (800) feet and the dead end terminus never was on a public highway of any kind, and this entire proposed road has always been a private road, and Edward Gill testified that he had lived at the end of the private road for at least 30 years. That the township supervisors have never done any work on this proposed road and any work on the road was done by those using it.

That 3 families are affected, John W. Brady at the bottom of the hill; Albert B. Johnson in the rear and to the North of Brady; and Edward Gill at the extreme Eastern end. That Brady has 3 children going to school and Johnson has 2 children going to school; and Gill has one son about 24 years of age. That both Brady and Johnson live about four hundred (400) feet from state highway No. 17038.

That about one hundred and thirty (130) feet from State Highway Route No. 17038 the proposed road passes over a small stream, and that the bridge over said stream should be raised as it will not take the water in wet times, and that when the water is high a man could not cross with knee boots. That an eight (8) foot span or culvert would

take the water. That the road drifts with snow in the winter time and makes it hard to get out. That the proposed road passes a picnic ground that would be used more if the road would be repaired.

That no testimony was supplied as to any damages that might result from the taking over of said road by the supervisors and no testimony was supplied as to the cost of a bridge or culvert that sooner or later be needed.

That Benjamin Hughes and Leo R. Brockbank, two of the viewers appointed by your Honorable Court, are of the opinion that there is no occasion for such a road and the same is not necessary for a public road. That Harry Reese has not signed this report as he differs with the report herewith submitted.

and that a plan or draft of said road showing courses and distances and the properties affected is hereto attached and made a part hereof, ~~said road having an elevation not exceeding five degrees from the horizontal~~

xwhenix was not yet to exit yet within that limit.

The said signers further report that they have endeavored to procure from all the owners of the land over which the said road passes, a written waiver of all claims to damages that may arise from opening the same, and that they have made such releases from

the following persons having right to release the damages to which they respectively may be entitled by reason of the location and meaning of the said read, who, the undersigned witness, after having considered the advantages to be derived to them by assessing them damages and in accordance therewith follows:

Also, viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.


Reviewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.




