

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 22nd day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-seven

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Beccaria in said County, setting forth ~~that~~ and pray that said Court require the Supervisors of Beccaria Township to take over the following streets and maintain them as township roads:  
Hill Street from Fulton Street to Main Street a distance of about 500 feet.  
Washington Street from Fulton Street to Market St. a distance of about 500ft.  
Jackson Street from Fulton Street to Market St. a distance of about 500 ft.  
Fulton Street from Union Street to Jackson St. a distance of about 600 ft.

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers A. E. Shaw, Attorney, William Yost and Benjamin Hughes

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgement, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing

# RETURN OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, be leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Beccaria and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road that the said view would be held on the 12th day of August A. D. 1947, and the hearing to be held in the ~~Arbitration~~ <sup>Grand Jury</sup> Room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 14th day of August, 1947, at 10:30 o'clock A.M. That three viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view Ed Berger, Dale O'donnell, and Carl E. Weakland, Supervisors of the Township of Beccaria, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is no occasion for a road as desired by the petitioners and that the same ~~is~~ are necessary for ~~a~~ the public road. And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for the public use the following described roads to wit ~~Beginning~~

The First Thereof to have its beginning at the point of intersection of Hill and Fulton Streets; thence running along Hill Street a distance of Seven hundred fifty (750) feet to State Highway Route #17111 in the village of Rosebud, Beccaria Township, Clearfield County, Penna.

The Second Thereof to have its beginning at the point of intersection of Washington and Fulton Streets; thence running along Washington Street, a distance of Five hundred sixty-four (564) feet to Market Street in the village of Rosebud, Beccaria Township, Clearfield County, Penna.

The Third Thereof to have its beginning at the point of intersection of Jackson and Fulton Streets; thence running along Jackson Street a distance of Five hundred sixty-four to Market Street in the village of Rosebud, Beccaria Township, Clearfield County, Penna.

The Fourth Thereof to have its beginning at the point of intersection of Fulton and Union Streets; thence running along Fulton Street a distance of Seven hundred twenty (720) feet to Jackson Street in the village of Rosebud, Beccaria Township, Clearfield County, Penna.

The proposed roads are laid out over dedicated, but unrecorded streets in the village of Rosebud, Beccaria Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, the same having a width of approximately forty (40) feet, parts of which are fenced in by the abutting property owners and for the past twenty-five years or more the individual property owners served by said streets have maintained and kept the same in repair for themselves, as well as, the traveling public, to the best of their ability.

That the abutting property owners are unable individually to adequately maintain said streets or proposed roads by giving them the proper grading and drainage required and as said streets or newly proposed roads are necessary for the convenience of the traveling public the same should be taken over and maintained at public expense.

That the taking over of said Streets as a part of the public road system of Beccaria Township, is agreeable to the Supervisors of said Township, and according to the great number of petitioners requesting the same, the newly proposed roads appear to be necessary for the accomodation of the traveling public, as well as, for the convenience of the persons living along said proposed roads, and in view of these facts, your undersigned Viewer's recommend that the same be taken over by the Supervisors of Beccaria Township to be incorporated and maintained as a part of the general road system of said Township.

and that a plan or draft of said road showing courses and distances and the properties affected is hereto attached and made a part hereof, said road being at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, excepting




when it was not practical to preserve it within that limit.

the following persons having refused to release the damages to which they respectively may be entitled by reason of the location and opening of the said road we the undersigned viewer after having considered the advantages to be derived to them to assess them damages and make report thereof as follows

The undersigned Viewer's further report that since the newly proposed roads have been laid out over dedicated streets and have long since been opened to public travel, no releases were obtained or damages awarded the abutting property owners as the advantages to be derived from said roads would far exceed the disadvantages, if any, to the abutting property owners. and we herewith return ~~releases obtained and~~ copy of the notices.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.


