The petition of the undersigned Supervisors of the Township of Chest, County of Clearfield and State of Pennsylvania, respectfully represents:

1. That a public road was laid out by authority of law extending from the intersection with Route No. 17 018, at or near Clyde Stiver's farm in a northerly direction to a point on the Jordan Township line near the George Mays property line in Chest Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, a distance of about 1.2 miles, as shown on the map or draft hereto attached, which said public road was designated as Route No. 422.

2. That said public road is no longer of use to the citizens of Chest Township and is inconvenient and burdensome to the Supervisors of said Township.

3. Your petitioners, therefore, pray the Court that said public road may be vacated, agreeably to the Acts of General Assembly in such cases made and provided.



~~xxxxxx~~ of the Township of Chest, in the County aforesaid setting forth that a public  
road was laid out by authority of law extending from the intersection with  
Route No. 17 018, at or near Clyde Stiver's farm in a northerly direction to a  
point on the Jordan Township line near the George Mays property line in Chest  
Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, a distance of about 1.2 miles, as  
shown on the map or draft hereto attached, which said public road was designated  
as Route No. 422.

That said public road is no longer of use to the citizens of Chest Township and is inconvenient and burdensome to the Supervisors of said Township.

Wherefore, Supervisors pray the Court that said public road may be vacated, agreeably to the Acts of General Assembly in such cases made and provided.

and, therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and vacate said road between the points mentioned, whereupon the said Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and ap-

point from and among the County Board of Viewers A. B. Shaw, William Yost and

Benjamin Hughes who have been duly appointed by the said Court on the County Board of Viewers, and filed their oaths of office in the office of the Court of Common Pleas of the County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through which said road passes.

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft, or plot, aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.

RETURN OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE PEACE, IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD, PA.

We, the undersigned Viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of the view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County, and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Chest, and that three notices

thereof were posted along the route of the said road to be vacated, that the said view would be held on the

18th day of February, A. D. 1947, and that the public hearing, as required by the Act of Assembly, and the Rules of Court, would be held in the ~~Administration~~ <sup>Grand Jury</sup> Room in the Court House, in Clearfield,

Pa., on the 20th day of February A. D., 1947 at 10:30 o'clock A. M., and that said Viewers, appointed by the said order, viewed the road desired to be vacated, and that there were present at the view T. C. McGarvey and Clyde Stivers, Supervisors of Chest Township.

Also Levi Hamer and Vincent Ballarotto

parties interested, either in favor of or against vacating said road. And that the aforesaid hearing was held in the ~~Administration~~ Room in the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 20th day of February,

A. D. 1947, when the parties interested in the said road were in attendance: John J. Urey, Esq., solicitor for Chest Township, together with T. C. McGarvey and Clyde Stivers, Supervisors of Chest Township, and William Michaels, Supervisor of Jordan Township. Also Dan P. Arnold, Esq., of the law firm of Chaplin & Arnold, representing Levi Hamer and Vincent Ballarotto, parties opposed to the vacation of said road.

That in further opposition to the vacation of said road, a petition was attempted to be offered in evidence by Dan P. Arnold, Esq. signed by more than 100 persons, which petition failed to disclose the residence and occupation of said petitioners, so in view of this fact the hearing was adjourned until Thursday the 27th day of February, 1947, at 10:30 A. M. in order that the residence of said petitioners could be established and that they be given an opportunity to testify as to the necessity of maintaining said Township road for the convenience of the traveling public. That at the time set for the adjourned hearing on Thursday, February 27th 1947, at 10:30 A. M. the Board of Viewers were advised by Dan P. Arnold, Esq., that none of said petitioners were able to attend said continued hearing and that the Viewers should file their report in accordance with the facts and evidence established at the first hearing on Thursday, February 20th, 1947.

Wherefore in order to establish an outlet and to create no hardship upon Mr. Ballaretto now using said Township road, Route No. 422, which your Viewers have recommended be vacated and abandoned, it is further recommended by your undersigned Viewers, in order to correct this condition, that the portion of said Township road beginning at the southern property line of Vincent Ballaretto; thence extending in a southerly direction for a distance of twenty-five hundred (2,500) feet to the point of intersection of said Township road with State Highway, Route No. 17018, be retained and established as a private road by the Court.

and that a plan, or draft, of said road to be vacated showing the courses and distances, and over whose property the said road passes, is hereto attached and made a part hereof.

~~The undersigned Viewers further report that they are called to produce from all parties affected by the proposed vacating of the said road a release in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from the vacation thereof, and that they do not do such unless so directed.~~



## ORDER TO VACATE

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.

Also, viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

Reviewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.


