

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 30th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and Forty-seven

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Pike Township in said County, setting forth that labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road leading from the public highway known as the Bailey Road in Pike Township at a point near the garage on the property of George J. Mayersky an approximate distance of eight hundred (800) feet in said Township to the dwelling house of George W. Mayersky.

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers A. B. Shaw,

Wm. W. Yost and Ed Pooler

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgement, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance. in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees; except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same; taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing.

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, be leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of

Pike and that three (3) notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 23rd day of December A. D. 1947 and the hearing to be held in the ^{Grand Jury} Arbitration Room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 26th day of December, 1947 at 10 o'clock A.M. That the viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view George W. Mayersky, the petitioner, and Dorsey Bilger, one of the Supervisor's of Pike Township.

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is no occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is not necessary for a public road: ~~XXXXXX having had respect to the~~

~~XXXXXX private property as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the~~

road leading from a point on Township road, Route No. 494 in Pike
Township, at or near the dwelling house of Philip Wellgus; thence
extending in a Southerly direction over and through a piece of thick
woodland owned by the said Philip Wellgus, for a distance of about
seven hundred and seventy-five (775) feet to the property line of
George W. Mayersky. That in order to transform said private road
into a public road with proper drainage and of the width required
by law, would necessitate the cutting down and removal of consider-
able saw timber. No figures on the approximate damage that would
be caused to the property of Philip Wellgus were presented before
your board of Viewers and since the owner of said land has refused
to sign ^arelease of damages, your undersigned Viewers are of the
opinion that the construction of said road is not necessary for
public travel and with the great expense involved, is unwarranted,
as well as unnecessary since it would not benefit the community at large.

That the only residents to be served by such a proposed public road would be that of George W. Mayersky, who has access to the main highway over a private road which has been in continuous use by him and his predecessors in title, for more than thirty (30) years last past.

That although your undersigned Viewers appreciate the desire and need of Mr. George W. Mayersky of a better road leading from his residence to the main highway, the necessity and circum-

stances surrounding this case do not warrant the Viewers in recommending that said private road be returned for public use and maintained at public expense.

Reviewers cannot interfere with the damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the plan they will report to that effect.


