The petition of the undersigned, citizens and tax-payers of the County of Clearfield, respectfully represents:

1. That they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road leading from the intersection of the Houtzdale and Brisbin roads, near the site of the old Sterling school-house, to the Goss Run Junction settlement.

2. That there are five families living in that settlement, with no out-let that is passable for vehicular traffic.

3. That the merchants refuse to deliver groceries and other necessities to the people living in their present homes; Doctors are unable to travel to their homes by automobile; and the funeral of one of the late residents could not be held from his home, and the friends had to be received at the home of a relative. Deliveries of lumber, coal and feed for their livestock demand extra charges and compensation.

4. That out-lets through Beaverton and Parsonville would require the building of bridges, and extra mileage of road.

Wherefore, your petitioners pray that a Board of Viewers be appointed, to lay out a public road, as provided by Act of Assembly. And they will ever pray.

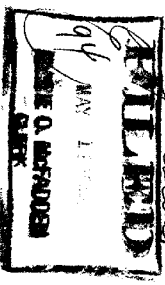

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly quali-
fied to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of
their judgement, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view
the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road
they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may,
be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner
as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly
whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or
draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which
the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at
an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when
by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that
limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they
shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any
damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land
refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into
view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of
such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter
Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they

RETURN OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, be leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Woodward and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 25th day of June A. D. 1948, and the hearing to be held in the Grand Jury Room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 28th day of June, 1948, at 11 o'clock A. M. That two viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that ~~there were present at the view~~ William S. Pooler and James H. Yarger, Supervisors of Woodward Twp., Lester Zimmerman, Dennis Hyde, Nellie Dipko, Mrs. Andrew Charney and Verna Zimmerman: Whereupon the View and Hearing were adjourned for two weeks. On July 9, 1948 the three Viewers viewed the premises; present also were W. S. Pooler, Supervisor, Mike Dipko, Joseph Yarger, Mrs. Rebo Mrs. Charney and Mrs. Zimmerman. That the hearing was held in the ~~Grand Jury Room~~ Grand Jury Room at the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 12th day of July A. D. 1948, when the following appearances were noted: Guy A. Heil, Benj. Hughes and John Scollins, Viewers; James Yarger and W. S. Pooler, Supervisors of Woodward Township; Michael Dipko; Nellie Dipko and Verna Zimmerman; all of whom were sworn, examined and cross-examined by the Board of Viewers.

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is no occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is not necessary for a public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we ~~have examined~~ in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, ~~and do hereby~~ surveyed ~~use~~ the following described road, to wit Beginning at the intersection of the township roads leading from Sterling (School House site) to Hontzdale and Brisbin, and the old right-of-way of the P. & S. Railroad; thence in a north-easterly direction along said right-of-way, 33 feet in width, seven hundred and sixty (760) feet to a small Run; thence still thereby in the same north-easterly direction, four hundred and seventy-three and five tenths (473.5) feet to a small Creek, Branch of Goss Run; thence along a public street laid out by Beaver Branch Coal Co., in the same north-easterly direction across Goss Run Branch Railroad, crossing, eight hundred and twenty-five (825) feet; and thence still thereby, in the same north-easterly direction, four hundred and sixty-eight (468) feet to the Decatur Township line, and ending at said line, being 2526.5 feet in length; the cost of building the said road, as estimated by Viewer, Guy A. Heil, and hereto attached and made a part of this Report, being \$28760.00.

From the testimony produced at the hearing there are 5 families to be served by the surveyed road; and as now used by the residents of that community, the ground is swampy and not passable for vehicular traffic; merchants refuse to deliver food and necessaries to these homes; Doctors are unable to make house-calls, except on foot, and the recent funeral of one of the residents had to be held from the home of a relative living where friends of the deceased could call; however, only one family resides in Woodward Township and the others live in Decatur Township.

In conclusion a majority of the Board finds that inasmuch as the Woodward Township family have access over a private road laid out by the Beaver Branch Coal Company, designated open streets and alleys, a public road is not necessary; and therefore recommends that the petition be denied.

and that a plan or draft of said road showing courses and distances and the properties affected is hereto attached and made a part hereof, said road being at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, excepting

when it was not practical to preserve it within that limit.

The undersigned further report that they endeavored to procure from all the owners of the land over which the said road passes releases in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from opening the same, and that they procured such releases from None.

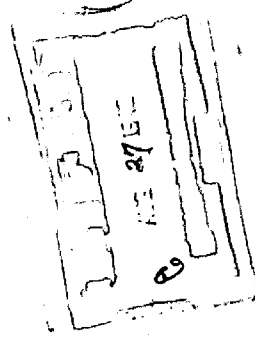

Minority Report.

To the Honorable F. Cortez Bell, President Judge of the Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

The undersigned viewer, John Scollins, appointed by your Honorable Court by the attached order, begs leave to file a minority Report, for the following reasons:

1. In the opinion of the undersigned there is occasion for a road as desired by the petitioners; and that the same is necessary for a public road.

2. That the residents of the Goss Run Settlement have lived there for upwards of 60 years; that during the coal mining period, before the exhaustion of the coal, the roads and streets laid out by the Coal Company were kept in a passable condition; that the streams, Goss Run and Beaver Run, that merge at "B-Z" junction have been allowed to fill up, with swamp grass, willow trees, and no longer have channel to carry the water; that the bridges were washed out during the 1936 Flood; and nothing has been done to carry off the water from their water-shed, as a result it has become stagnant; and these citizens are obliged to travel by foot over the abandoned P. & S. Railway bed, over a dangerous unbridged creek (Goss Run), which is unfit for such travel.

3. The cost of building a public road and bridge is estimated at \$28,760.00; which includes an item of \$17,000.00 for a reinforced concrete bridge, which in the opinion of the undersigned Viewer is unnecessary as a wooden structure would suffice for the use to be made of it; and the cost is immaterial in view of the necessity for the road.

The undersigned Viewer therefore recommends that the prayer of the petitioners be granted; and an order made to lay out the road as surveyed.
