To the Honorable F. Cortez Bell, Judge of said Court:

The petition of MERLE JOHNSTON, WAYNE JOHNSON, and FRANK PASSMORE, Supervisors of the Township of Greenwood, County of Clearfield and State of Pennsylvania, respectfully represents:

1. That the Pennsylvania Department of Highways constructed and completed a highway leading from Grampian to Mahaffey on December 16, 1926, known as Route No. 62, Section A-2 and which is presently known as State Highway Route No. 219.

2. That the said State Highway Route No. 219 more specifically transverses Greenwood Township in the vicinity known as Johnson Hill which is located southwest of Grampian.

3. That prior to and after the construction of the said highway Route No. 219, an unpaved township road No. 17461 transversed Greenwood Township in the vicinity of Johnson Hill.

4. That no traffic uses the unpaved township road No. 17461 beginning at a point approximately one hundred fifty (150') feet southwest of L. K. Johnston home and leading southwest to the line of land of Lew Haines Estate and individuals living in the vicinity do not use the same as a means of approaching their respective properties from said Route No. 219.

5. That the said township road No. 17461 between the point one hundred fifty (150') feet southwest of L. K. Johnston home and line of land of Lew Haines Estate, a distance of approximately eight-tenth (.8) of a mile, has been abandoned and has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome.

Your petitioners therefore pray that a portion of the said road described above be vacated, agreeably to the Act of the General Assembly in such case made and provided.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF THE PEACE, IN AND FOR THE
COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD, PA.

We, the undersigned Viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order, from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, beg leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of the view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County, and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Greenwood, and that four (4) notices thereof were posted along the route of the said road to be vacated, that the said view would be held on the 19th day of August, A. D. 1948, and that the public hearing, as required by the Act of Assembly, and the Rules of Court, would be held in the ^{Grand Jury} Arbitration Room in the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 19th day of August A. D., 1948, at 10:00 o'clock A. M., and that said Viewers, appointed by the said order, viewed the road desired to be vacated, and that there were present at the view Leo F. Brockbank, William Vost and Edward Pooler, viewers, Frank Passmore, Supervisor of Greenwood Township, and Mrs. Walker Miles, whose property joins on the particular road at one side.

That said road known as Township Road No. 17461 was formerly the road that was used for travel in this vicinity, and the part under consideration is crooked, and up a steep hill, and in the woods, and at the present time the ruts in said road are very deep and traveling over it is practically impossible, although on the day the viewers were present a coal truck from a stripping operation was using the upper part of this hill. About the year 1923 the Pennsylvania Department of Highways completed a highway through this territory known as route No. 219, which is a cement road, and since that time there has been little or no use for this part under discussion as it is, generally speaking, in the form of a semi-circle, both ends of which meet the cement highway, and all traveling, of course, follows the paved road. At the view on the ground there appeared in person Mrs. Walker Miles, who desired a small portion on the western end kept open as it is the most convenient means of access for her and this small portion is the only part of the road that is in good condition, said portion being about 450 to 500 feet in length. 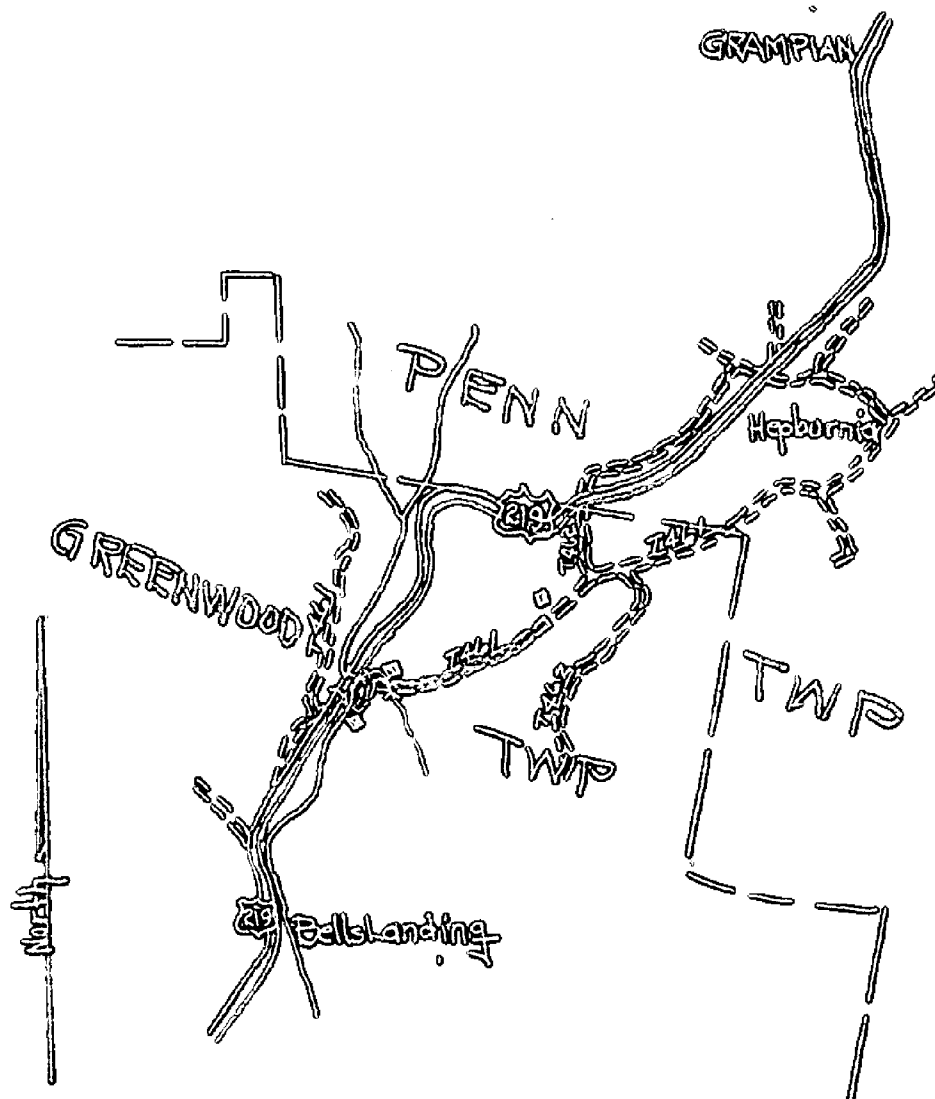

who have been duly appointed by the said Court on the County Board of Viewers, and filed their oaths of office in the office of the Court of Common Pleas of the County aforesaid, as required by law and are, therefore, duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment, with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment; are to view the said road, and after having viewed the same, if they, or a majority of them, do agree that there is no necessity for said road, they shall proceed to vacate the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, and make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held in and for said County, stating particularly whether there is any necessity for said road, or whether the same should be vacated; and the reason why, together with a plot, or draft, thereof showing the courses and distances with reference to the improvements through which said road passes.

And in case the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating said road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road passes, or otherwise affected, or damaged, by the vacating of said road, releases from whatever damage they may sustain by the vacation of said road; and in case the owners of such lands, or persons affected, thereby refuse to release their claim to damages, the said Viewers shall assess the same, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages, arising from the vacation of said road; and make report of such assessment; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft, or plot, aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn, or affirmed, according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when and the place where they would meet, to view said road and the time and place of hearing.



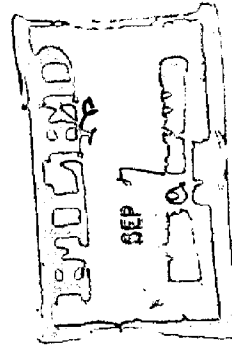
NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.
