1. That on the 27th day of September, 1949, notice was given of intention on the part of the Board of Supervisors of Union Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, to vacate or abandon certain sections of Township road by Ordinances.


2. That attached hereto is a copy of notices served on the property owners affected by the said abandonment.

Dear Sir or Madam:

Pursuant to the Act of July 10, 1947, P.L. 1481 Article XI, it is the intention of the Supervisors of the Township of Union, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, to consider the abandonment of a township road more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point on Township route 360; thence along its several courses and distances in a generally southeasterly direction and crossing the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad tracks and extending to a point on Little Anderson Creek the boundary line between Bloom and Union Townships. Said road being 1.1 miles in length and being known and designated on the Township road map of Union Township, Clearfield County, as Township Road 499.

A meeting of the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Union will be held at 7:30 o'clock P.M. on Friday, October 14, 1949, in the Township Building, Village of Rockton, Union Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, when and where you may attend and be heard concerning the proposed abandonment of the herein before described Township road, if you so desire.

ORDINANCE NO. 2

AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE A ROAD OR SECTION OF ROAD WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF UNION, CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

WHEREAS, in the judgment of the Supervisors of Union Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, it is in the interest of public convenience and economy to vacate, by Ordinance, a section of road herein described, now therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Supervisors of Union Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same.

Section 1. That in the judgment of the Supervisors, the following described road be and the same is hereby vacated:

Beginning at a point on Township route 360; thence along its several courses and distances in a generally southeasterly direction and crossing the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad tracks and extending to a point on Little Anderson Creek the boundary line between Bloom and Union Townships. Said road being 1.1 miles in length and being known and designated on the Township road map of Union Township, Clearfield County, as Township Road 499.

Section 2. That the Township Solicitor is authorized and directed to file a certified copy of the Ordinance in the office of the Court of Quarter Sessions together with the names of the owner or owners of property effected by the vacation of said road and a draft and survey of the road.

Section 3. That the Township Secretary shall within ten days from the date of this Ordinance give notice by handbills, posted in conspicuous places along the line of the proposed vacation; such notice shall state the fact of the passage of this Ordinance and the date of the passage.

Section 4. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.





Pursuant to Article XI of the Act of July 10, 1947, P.L. 1481 the Supervisors of Union Township hereby give notice that under the following Ordinance, sections of this road hereinafter described have been vacated by the Board of Supervisors of Union Township.

By Ordinance No. 2, enacted October 14, 1939, and recorded in Ordinance Book No. 1, page 5, the following described road is vacated:

Beginning at a point on Township route 360; thence along its several courses and distances in a generally southwesterly direction and crossing the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad tracks and extending to a point on Little Anderson Creek the boundary line between Bloom and Union Townships, said road being 1.1 miles in length and being known and designated on the Township road map of Union Township, Clearfield County, as Township road 499.

A report and draft concerning the above Ordinance has been filed in the office of the Clerk of the Court of Quarter Sessions on the 3 day of ~~Dec~~, 1940, in pursuance of the above mentioned Act of Assembly.
