AMENDED PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGE OF THE ABOVE NAMED COURT:

The Petition of the Board of Supervisors of Sandy Township, Clearfield County, respectfully represents:-

1. Your petitioners have passed an Ordinance a copy of which is hereto attached, together with proof of publication and map of the Highways, adopting as Township Highways two certain pieces of the highway situated in Sandy Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, the first consisting of 7,174 feet and the second consisting of 2,464 feet both of which are located on the map hereto attached and made a part hereof.

2. The said Highway to be adopted by the Township, was originally constructed and paved out of the funds of the Township of Sandy, prior to the establishment of the State Highway system of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

3. After the said State Highway system was established by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the said road was taken over and incorporated in part of the highway system of the said Commonwealth.

4. Subsequently the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, re-located and built a new highway known as Pennsylvania Department of Highway, Route No. 402, replacing and supplanting the said highway and vacated and abandoned the same as part of the said highway system.

5. Following the abandonment of the said highway by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the Board of Supervisors of Sandy Township, did not at any time take over or assume any responsibility for the said highway, nor did the Township take any action to re-incorporate the said highway into the highway system of the Township of Sandy.

6. The said Highway, which is proposed to be included in the highway system of the Township of Sandy, has been a public road for a period of more than Fifty (50) years, and since the abandonment of the said road by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, has been in continuous use by residents and abutting property owners, as well as by the community of the Narrows Creek Park Association where approximately ten or fifteen homes are located.

7. The abutting property owners along the said highway, as well as the property owners of the Narrows Creek Park Association have all petitioned the Board of Supervisors of Sandy Township to include the said highway in the highway system of the Township of Sandy, for the purpose of repair and maintenance of the said highway.

8. In pursuance of said petition the Board of Supervisors passed the Ordinance as hereto attached and adopted the said highway system under the facts aforesaid and believes that the said road is a public highway as declared under the Act of July 10, 1947, P. L. 14, 81, Section 17; 53 P. S. 19093-1105.

WHEREFORE, your petitioners pray that the said Ordinance and adoption of the highway herein prayed for be confirmed.



ORDINANCE NO. ✓

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AND OPENING TWO PUBLIC ROADS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF SANDY, COUNTY OF CLEARFIELD AND STATE OF PENNSYLVANIA, NORTH OF PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAY ROUTE 402.

BE IT ORDAINED AND IT IS HEREBY enacted and Ordained by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Sandy, County of Clearfield and State of Pennsylvania, as follows:-

Section 1. A Township Road is hereby established and opened BEGINNING at a point One Hundred and Eighty (180) feet West of Lick Run Bridge under Pennsylvania Department Highway, Route No. 402, said point being about one mile east of the City of DuBois; thence extending in a north eastern direction along an old abandoned paved highway a distance of 7174 feet to its jointure with Sandy Township Route #854 and being Thirty-Three (33) feet wide, along said center line.

Section 2. A public road is hereby established and opened BEGINNING at a point of the intersection of Pennsylvania Department of Highways Routes #17091 and #402 and then extending in a South Westerly direction a distance of 2464 feet, said road being on the North side of Pennsylvania Department Highway Route #402 and approximately parallel to it, and being Thirty-Three (33) feet wide, along said center line.

Section 3. Said roads are hereby declared to be part of the Township Road System of the Township of Sandy, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

Section 4. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances  
inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.


