

Road Viewers' Notice

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the undersigned Viewers, appointed by the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, to view a Road ~~xxxxxx~~ ~~dangerous leading from~~ beginning at the point of intersection of St. James Street with the improved Highway Route #17135 leading from State Highway Route #53, via the Village of Sterling, to the Borough of Brisbin; thence in a Westerly direction over St. James Street to Rush Street; thence over Rush Street to Penn Street; and thence in an Easterly direction over Penn Street to the intersection of Allegheny Street and the Township Road leading from the Borough ~~xxx~~ of Houtzdale to ~~township~~ Sterling, said proposed road being approximately fifteen hundred (1500) feet in length and extends over streets and ways dedicated to public use in said Village of Sterling

THAT A PUBLIC HEARING AS REQUIRED BY THE ACT OF ASSEMBLY AND RULES OF COURT, TO BE HELD BY THE VIEWERS BEFORE THE FILING OF THEIR REPORT IN COURT, IN ORDER TO GIVE ALL PARTIES INTERESTED IN SAID PROPOSED ROAD AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE HEARD, WILL BE HELD IN THE GRAND JURY ROOM IN THE COURTHOUSE AT CLEARFIELD, PENNSYLVANIA, ON WEDNESDAY, THE TWENTIETH DAY OF MAY, A. D. 1953, AT 10:30 O'CLOCK A. M. (DST), AT WHICH TIME AND PLACE ALL PARTIES INTERESTED IN SAID PROPOSED ROAD MAY ATTEND AND BE HEARD, IF THEY SO DESIRE.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 27th day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty- three

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Woodward

in said County, setting forth that your petitioners labor

under great inconvenience for want of a township road or highway, beginning at the intersection of St. James Street with the improved Highway 17135 leading from State Route 53, via the village of Sterling to the Borough of Brisbin; thence in a Westerly direction over St. James street to Rush street; thence over Rush street to Penn Street; and thence Eastwardly over Penn street to the intersection of Allegheny Street and the township road leading from the Borough of Houtzdale, approximately 1500 feet in length, and dedicated to public use in said village of Sterling.

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers William W. Yost, Benjamin Hughes and A.B. Shaw

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgement, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing

RETURN OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, be leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Woodward and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 18th day of May A. D. 1953, and the hearing to be held in the Arbitration Room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 20th day of May, A. D., 1953 at 10:30 o'clock A. M. That three viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view Benjamin Zimmerman, Lillian LaHave, Arvida Archer, George Love, petitioners and parties in interest, also Blair Smith and Gordon Fowler, Supervisors of the Road District of the Township of Woodward, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the Arbitration Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 21st day of May, A. D. 1953, when the following appearances were noted: Benjamin Zimmerman, Lillian LaHave, Arvida Archer, George Love, petitioners and parties in interest, also Blair Smith and Gordon Fowler, Supervisors of the Road District of the Township of Woodward, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is - - occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is - - - necessary for a Public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for Public use the following described road, to wit: Beginning At the point of intersection of St. James Street with improved State Highway Route #17135 in the Village of Sterling, Woodward Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania; thence extending in a Westerly direction over St. James Street a distance of 928 feet to a 20 foot Public Alley (mistakenly taken by the petitioners for Rush Street, which was never opened due to its impracticable location and the excessive cost of building and maintaining same across declivity); thence over said alley in a Southerly direction 354 feet to Penn Street; thence over Penn Street in an Easterly direction 595 feet to point of intersection with Township Road leading from Houtzdale to the Village of Sterling, Woodward Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

The proposed road is laid out over dedicated, but unrecorded, streets and an alley in the Village of Sterling, Woodward Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, the street having a width of 50 feet and the alley 20 feet, parts of which are fenced in by the abutting property owners; and for the past thirty years or more the individual property owners served by said streets and alley have maintained and kept the same in repair for themselves, as well as for the traveling public, to the best of their ability.

That the abutting property owners are unable individually to adequately maintain said streets and alley, over which said proposed road shall pass, by giving them the proper grading and drainage required, and, as stated, the newly proposed road is necessary for the convenience of the traveling public and the same should be taken over and maintained

at public expense.

That the taking over of said streets and alley as a part of the public road system of Woodward Township is agreeable to the Supervisors of said Township and according to the great number of petitioners requesting the same, the newly proposed road appears to be necessary for the accommodation of the traveling public, as well as for the convenience of persons living along said proposed road. In view of these facts, your undersigned Viewers recommend that the same be taken over by the Road District of the Township of Woodward to be incorporated and maintained as a part of the general road system of said Township

and that a plan or draft of said road showing courses and distances and the properties affected is hereto attached and made a part hereof, said road being at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, excepting _____

when it was not practical to preserve it within that limit.

The undersigned further report that they endeavored to procure from all the owners of the land over which the said road passes releases in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from opening the same and that they procured such releases from xxxxxxxxxxxxxxx



the following persons having refused to release the damages to which they respectfully may be entitled by reason of the location and opening of the said road, we, the undersigned viewers, after having considered the advantages to be derived to them do assess them damages and make report thereof as follows:

The undersigned Viewers further report that since the newly proposed road has been laid out over dedicated streets and an alley and has long since been opened to public travel, no releases were obtained or damages awarded the abutting property owners as the advantages to be derived from said road would far exceed the disadvantages, if any, to the abutting property owners.

ORDER

To view and lay out a road for public use in the township of Woodward, Clearfield County Pennsylvania

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.

Also, viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

Reviewers cannot interfere with the damages reassessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.


