REPORT OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF KARTHAUS
TOWNSHIP, CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

TO THE HONORABLE JOHN J. PENTZ, PRESIDENT JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

The board of Supervisors of Karthaus Township,
Clearfield County, Pennsylvania respectfully report as follows:

✓ 1. that the undersigned were duly elected and
qualified as Supervisors of the township of Karthaus, Clearfield
County, Pennsylvania.

2. That one of the parties in interest in the matter of the abandonment of the township road as below described to wit: James E. Hoffman, received notice of the proposed ordinance and of the meeting in regard thereto and waived the ten day time requirement in regard to the same, a copy of said notice and waiver being marked as exhibit "A", is attached hereto and made a part of this report.

3. that the Supervisors as aforesaid, pursuant to the provisions of the Act of 1933 P.L. 511 Sec. 1102 (a), 53 P.S. 19093 - 1102 (a), gave ten days written notice by registered mail to all other known persons in interest, of the proposed passage of an ordinance vacating the below described road and of the meeting in regard thereto; that further the said Supervisors caused to be posted similar notices on the road in question.

4. That attached to and made a part of this report is the affidavit of mailing the said notices together with the return receipts therefrom, marked as exhibit "B" and that also attached hereto and marked exhibit "C" is a copy of the said notice.

5. That pursuant to the notices as aforesaid a meeting of the Karthaus Township Supervisors was held at the residence of Robert J. Potter in the Village of Karthaus, Karthaus Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, on the 28th day of March, 1955 at 7:30 o'clock p.m. and that at the said meeting the following persons were present:

Homer Stroup, Chairman of the Board of Supervisors.
Robert J. Potter, Supervisor
Mike Kolivaski, Supervisor
Irene Potter, Secretary of the Board of Supervisors
Paul Shadick, party in interest
B.B. Mercer, representing the New York Central Railroad, party in interest.
and that no other party in interest was present.

6. That at the said meeting as aforesaid both of the parties in interest present, were given opportunity to address the Board of Supervisors.

7. That the road or route, proposed to be vacated is described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of Township Route #748 and this Route, in the Village of Karthaus and North of the Susquehanna River and the New York Central Railroad, thence by its various courses and distances, crossing and re-crossing the said New York Central Railroad, and in a generally North Easterly direction three and five tenths (3.5) miles to the intersection of this Route with Karthaus Township Route #752, and being known and designated as Karthaus Township Route #747 and being a road thirty-three (33') feet in width.

8. That attached hereto, made a part hereof and marked exhibit "D" is a copy of the proposed ordinance to vacate the above described Township Road.

9. That attached hereto, made a part hereof and marked exhibit "E" is a draft or survey of the road in question whereon the width of the road is fixed at thirty-three feet.

10. That there are no improvements along the line of the said road.

11. That in the opinion of the undersigned Supervisors the vacating of the before described road or route is necessary to the public convenience.

WHEREFORE, the undersigned Board of Road Supervisors of Karthaus Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, respectfully requests the Court to confirm this report N1. Si., confirmation absolute to be made by the Clerk of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, as of course, unless exceptions thereto are filed within thirty days of the N1. Si. confirmation as allowed by law.







AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE A TOWNSHIP ROAD ENTIRELY WITHIN THE
TOWNSHIP OF KARTHAUS, CLEARFIELD COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

BE IT ORDAINED and enacted by the Supervisors
of the Township of Karthaus, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania,
and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of
the same:

SECTION 1. The following described road is
hereby vacated as a Township Road in the Township of Karthaus
Clearfield County, Pennsylvania:

Beginning at the intersection of Township Route #748 and this Route in the Village of Karthaus and North of the Susquehanna River and the New York Central Railroad, thence by its various courses and distances, crossing and re-crossing the said New York Central Railroad, and in a generally North Easterly direction three and five tenths (3.5) miles to the intersection of this Route with Karthaus Township Route 752, and being known and designated as Karthaus Township Route #747 and being a road thirty-three (33') feet in width.




