To the Honorable John J. Pentz, President Judge of said Court:

The petition of the undersigned, citizens, inhabitants and tax-payers of the Township of Woodward, in said County of Clearfield, respectfully represents:

1. That your petitioners labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway, beginning at the intersection of the proposed road with Township Route 654, leading from Route 353 to Route 53, in the village of Pacific: thence in an Easterly direction over the abandoned railroad right-of-way to the residence of Andrew Kowatch, approximately 700 feet in length.

2. That the present existing roads and paths traversed in going to and from the improved roads leading to schools, churches, professional offices and business places are unkept, muddy and impassable during wintry and inclement weather, and dangerous for public travel, by children on foot, and motor vehicle travel.

WHEREFORE, your petitioners pray your Honorable Court to appoint a Board of Viewers, to view and lay out a road for public use and travel, according to law.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, Pa., in and for said County, on the 29th day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred Fifty Five

Judge of the same Court: Upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Woodward in said County, setting forth that Beginning at the intersection of the proposed road with Township Route 654, leading from Route 353 to Route 53, in the village of Pacific; thence in an Easterly direction over the abandoned railroad right-of-way to the residence of Andrew Kowatch, approximately 700 feet in length.

and therefore, praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road between the points mentioned, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint from and among the County Board of Viewers A. B. Shaw

Ben Hughes and Guy Heil

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly qualified to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of their judgement, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time and place of hearing

RETURN OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, be leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Woodward and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 21st day of September A. D. 1955, and the hearing to be held in the Arbitration Room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 23rd day of September 1955, at 10:30 o'clock A.M. That the viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view Gordon Fowler, Carl Swartz, and John J. Higgins, Supervisors of Woodward Township, also Albert Petrisky, Paul Takach, Andrew Kowatch, and Michael B. Susko.

parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the Arbitration Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 23rd day of September A. D. 1955, when the following appearances were noted: Albert Petrisky, Paul Takach, Andrew Kowatch, and Michael B. Susko, also Gordon Fowler, Carl Swartz, and John J. Higgins, Supervisors of Woodward Township.

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is no occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is not necessary for a public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for public use the following described road, to wit Beginning at the point of intersection of Township Road Rt. No. 654 in the Village of Pacific, Woodward Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania; thence extending in a Northwesterly direction partly over an abandoned railroad right-of-way and partly over a dedicated alley in the Plan or Plot of Lots of the Village of Pacific, a distance of Eleven Hundred Forty-four (1144) feet to the residence of Andrew Kowatch in said Village of Pacific, Woodward Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

The proposed road herein above described is laid out partly over an old railroad right-of-way which has been abandoned for over fifty (50) years and partly over a dedicated, but unrecorded alley-way which traversed said railroad right-of-way, in the Plan or Plot of Lots of the Village of Pacific, Woodward Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, and has long since been used by the property owners of this area as a private road. That for many years the individual property owners served by said private road, have kept the same in repair at their own cost and expence, and during certain seasons of the year the same becomes impassable, due to lack of proper grading and drainage and in the opinion of your undersigned Viewers, the newly proposed road that has been laid out is necessary for the accomodation and convenience of the traveling public and should be kept up and maintained as a public road at public expense.

There are no objections to the proposed road as layed out in accordance to the great number of Petitioners requesting the same,

including the Supervisors of the Road District of the Township of Woodward, its construction and maintenance seems to be necessary for the accomodation and convenience of the traveling public, as well as, for the convenience and accomodation of the six (6) families living along said proposed road, who must use the same as their only means of excess to and from their homes to the main highway, so in view of these facts your undersigned Board of Viewers recommend the taking over and improvement of the aforesaid proposed road, as laid out by the Road District of the Township of Woodward, for the use of the traveling public.

and that a plan or draft of said road showing courses and distances and the properties affected is hereto attached and made a part hereof, said road being at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, excepting when it was not practical to preserve it within that limit.

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.


Also, viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.


