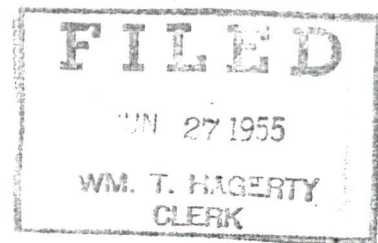

REPORT OF HEARING

It being desirable in the opinion of the Township Supervisors of Burnside Township to annex and take over a road hereinafter described, under the Act of May 1, 1933, Article XI Section 1101 as amended, June 4, 1955 at 10:00 o'clock A.M. at the home of J. C. Brothers was duly set as the time and place for Hearing.

Ten (10) days written notice of the time and place for hearing having been given, to all property owners affected by the proposed annexation, hearing was duly held at the time and place as set out above to consider the annexation of the following road:

BEGINNING at a point on Township Road 300, said point being South Eighteen (18) Degrees Forty-five (45) Minutes East two Hundred nineteen and Eighty-six hundredths (219.86) feet from the intersection of Township Road 300 with Route 219; thence North Seventy-one (71) Degrees Fourteen (14) Minutes East Three Hundred Forty-four and Eighty-four hundredths (344.84) feet to a point; thence North Seventy-six (76) degrees Forty (40) Minutes east Seven Hundred Fifty-six (756.0) and no hundredths feet to a point on the line of land of Mrs. Lily Leamer.

At the hearing it was reported by property owners that the property affected is being developed as homesites and the upkeep and maintenance of this private road is retarding the further development of the property. The Township Supervisors being familiar with the road and the conditions existing, are of the opinion that it will be a great benefit to the community for the Township to take over this road and that its annexation is necessary and proper for the public convenience. *An Ordinance to*

Minutes East seven hundred thirty-six (736.0) feet to
a point on the line of land of Mrs.
J. L. Leamer.
