CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the 23rd day of June A. D. 1866 before the Judges of the said Court upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Brimfield in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway to lead from the end of a

lane off the land of Othello Smith
to a point on or near the land
of Daniel Byers—

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

H. Patchin, Joseph Mitchell & W. Amers

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

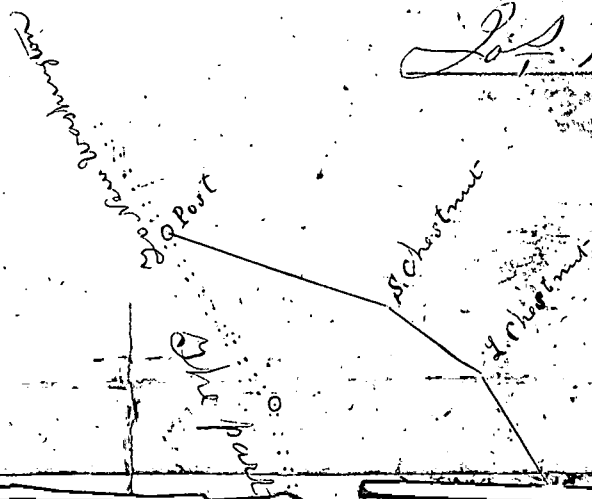

 by the within order of Court to view &
 lay out the road therein mentioned
 having first been duly sworn according
 to law. Do report that in pursuance
 of the said order we have reviewed laid
 out & returned for public use the follow
 ing road viz: Beginning at north end of Otello
 Smeed's line in the center of the public
 road leading from East Ridge to New Wash
 ington Thence North twenty four degrees East
 thirty two perches to a post near Smeed's gate
 thence North seven & a quarter degrees West
 forty seven perches to a small pine on land
 of James M. Emery Thence North thirty one
 and a quarter degrees West nine perches to a large
 chestnut Thence North fifty four degrees
 West twelve perches to a small chestnut
 Thence North seventy one & a quarter
 West twenty four perches to the center
 of said road leading to New Washington
 A Draught whereof is hereunto annexed
