J. Wallace*

to the public road opposite

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ~~lay out~~ ^{re. vacate & supply} the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

John L. Cutler, W. L. Shaw & Joseph Owens

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, ^{Subs. of Pet.} are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions -

The undersigned viewers appointed by an order of Court to view, a road from near Morris F. Wallace to the public road opposite Martin Klimes, respectfully report that they went upon the ground, and after being first duly sworn according to law, laid out and now return for public use the following road, a plot or draft of which is hereto annexed. Beginning at a point on public road from brow of hill, South 61° West eighty eight perches to a Hemlock, N 88° W. forty six perches to a forked White Pine, and South 51° West Fifty six perches to a pine stump at Public road leading to Butters and opposite Martin Klimes house. A release of all damages is attached showing the proprietors of the cleared land relinquish all claims for injuries. The balance of the road passing through unimproved land, and no damages are sustained. Adjournments of the time and place of the meeting of the viewers were duly posted at six public points in the township, and they recommend that the part of the road bearing N 34 E. 104 perches length, to be vacated.

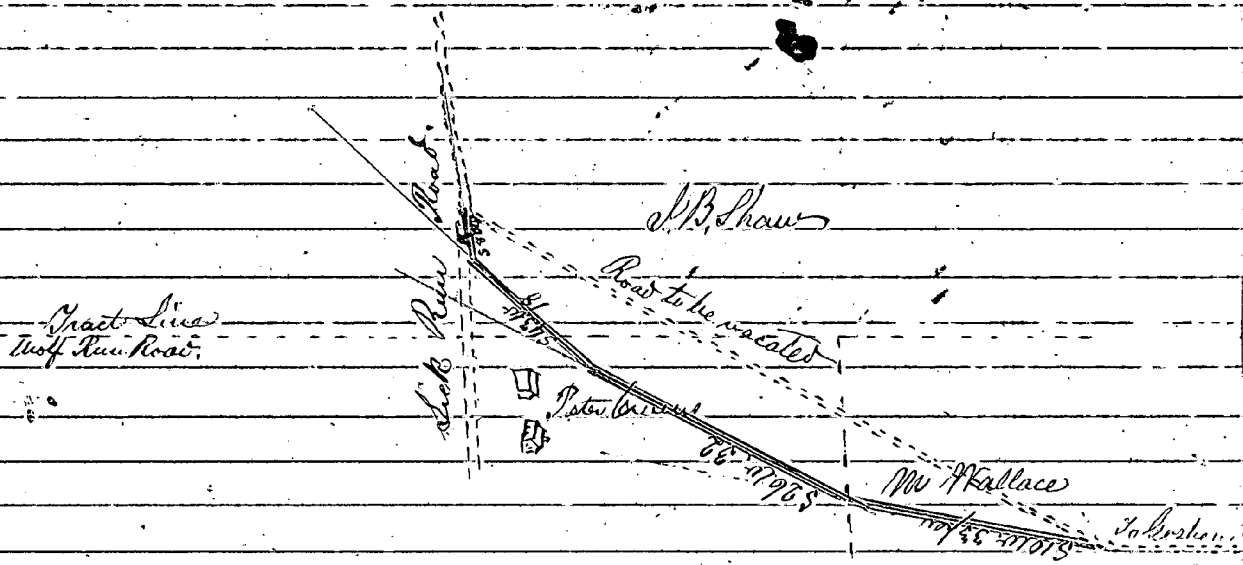
