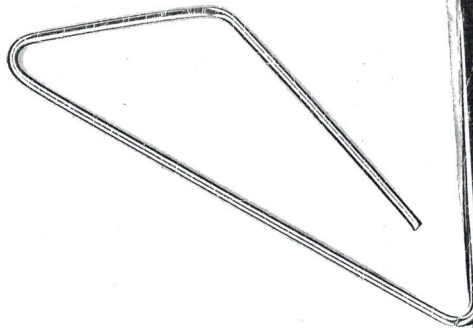




RETURN OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Clearfield:

We, the undersigned viewers, duly appointed by your Honorable Court by the foregoing order from and among the County Board of Viewers who have been duly appointed by your Honorable Court and have filed their oaths of office in the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County, be leave to report as follows:

That notice of the time of view and of the hearing day was duly served according to law upon the Commissioners of Clearfield County and the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Woodward and that three notices thereof were posted along the route of the proposed road, that the said view would be held on the 18th day of June ¹⁹⁵⁸ A. D. ^{Grand Jury} ~~1957~~, and the hearing to be held in the ~~Arbitration~~ ^{Grand Jury} Room, at the Court House, in Clearfield, Pa., on the 20th day of June, ¹⁹⁵⁸ ~~1957~~, at 1:30 o'clock ^{DST} ~~P.M.~~ That the viewers appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed for the above mentioned road, and that there were present at the view Carl Swartz, John Higgins, Supervisors of Woodward Twp., also James Tuba and other property owners whose names were not noted.

^{Grand Jury} parties in interest. That the hearing was held in the ~~Arbitration~~ Room, in the Court House, at Clearfield, Pa., on the 20th day of June A. D. ¹⁹⁵⁸ ~~1957~~, when the following appearances were noted: Carl Swartz, John Higgins and Albert Patrusky, Supervisors of Woodward Twp., also John M. Green and James Tuba, parties in interest.

After the view and hearing above mentioned, the undersigned, the majority of the said viewers, do agree that there is an occasion for a road as desired by the petitioner, and that the same is not necessary for a public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioner, and do return for public use the following described road, to wit Beginning at point of intersection of proposed road with public road leading from Brisbin to Pacific No. 1 and the abandoned siding right-of-way, at the property of Mrs. Elizabeth Zakutney; thence extending in a general Northwesterly direction for a distance of 3279 feet and ending at Township Road leading from Brisbin to Henderson's X-Roads near the property of Amy Castiaux at Ocean Tabernacle in said Township of Woodward, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

The proposed road is laid out over a private road having a width of approximately 20-feet, long since in existence and used by the petitioners and residents of this area. That for the past 30 years or more the individual property owners served by said private road which leads from their places of residences to the main highway, have kept and maintained said road in repairs for themselves, as well as, for the traveling public to ~~the~~ best of their ability.

That the seven families specially served by said private road have twelve or more children of school age, who must use said private road in going to and from school, and because of its bad state of repair is impassable by motor vehicles during certain seasons of the year, and at times when illness has occurred in the families served by said road it was found impossible to obtain the needed services of an attending physician.

That the abutting property owners are unable individually to adequately maintain said private road by giving it the proper grading and drainage required, and as said newly proposed road, which has been laid out over said private road, is necessary for the accommodation of the abutting property owners, who will be especially benefited by said proposed road, as well as for the accommodation and convenience of the

who have been duly appointed by the Court and filed their oaths of office and are duly quali-
fied to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and according to the best of
their judgement, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they view
the same, and a majority of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road
they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioner as may,
be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such a manner
as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly
whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or
draft thereof, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which
the same may pass; (and wherever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at
an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, when
by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that
limit,) to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County.

And if the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating a public road, they
shall obtain from the persons through whose lands the said road shall pass, releases from any
damages that may arise to them on opening the same; but if the owner or owners of such land
refuse to release their claim to damages, the said viewers shall assess the same, taking into
view the advantages as well as disadvantages arising from said location, and make report of
such assessments; which report they shall in like manner transmit to the next Court of Quarter
Sessions, with the draft or plot aforesaid. In which said reports they shall state that they
have been sworn or affirmed according to law, and that due and legal notice was given of the
time when, and place where, they should meet, to view and lay out said road, and the time
and place of hearing
