P E T I T I O N

The Petition of Arthur Roussey, John Hoffman and Francis Royer respectfully represents:

1. That they are the duly elected Supervisors of Covington Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

2. That on May 22, 1957, Emory Gormont dedicated a certain subdivision in the Township of Covington, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania as recorded in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds in Miscellaneous Book No. 106 at page 112. Therein he dedicated as public streets, forty (40) feet in width:

FIRST: Deer Haven Lane, being forty (40) feet in width, from Pennsylvania State Highway Route 17052 in a Northerly direction approximately 1950 feet to Ferndale Road.

SECOND: Ferndale Road, being forty (40) feet in width, from Deer Haven Lane in an Easterly direction approximately 600 feet.

THIRD: Lindbrook Road, being forty (40) feet in width, in an Westerly direction approximately 650 feet.

3. The acceptance of said streets would be a benefit to the public and to Covington Township.

4. Attached hereto and made a part hereof is a certified copy of a Resolution duly passed by the Board of Supervisors of Covington Township accepting said streets and also a plan of the streets, Deer Haven Lane, Lindbrook Road and Ferndale Road.

WHEREFORE, your Petitioners request that your Honorable Court consent to the acceptance of Deer Haven Lane, Lindbrook Road and Ferndale Road as a part of the public road system of Covington Township, by endorsing your consent hereto.

R E S O L U T I O N

ADOPTING AND ACCEPTING STREETS SITUATED IN THE EMORY GORMONT SUB-DIVISION TO BE KNOWN AS DEER HAVEN LANE, LINDBROOK ROAD AND FERNDALE ROAD.

WHEREAS, Emory Gormont has dedicated a certain plot of ground in Covington Township, known as the Emory Gormont sub-division. Said plot being recorded in Clearfield County in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds in Miscellaneous Book 106 at page 112, and

WHEREAS, certain streets forty (40) feet in width were dedicated as public streets in said plot, and

WHEREAS, it would be to the advantage of the property owners and the public in genral to have said streets forty (40) feet in width as part of the road system of Covington Township.

BE IT RESOLVED THEREFORE THAT the streets hereinafter designated, being forty (40) feet in width, be and are hereby accepted as township streets subject to the consent of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County, Pennsylvania,

FIRST: Deer Haven Lane, being forty (40) feet in width, from Pennsylvania State Highway Route 17052 in a Northerly direction approximately 1950 feet to Ferndale Road.

SECOND: Ferndale Road, being forty (40) feet in width, from Deer Haven Lane in an Easterly direction approximately 600 feet.

THIRD: Lindbrook Road, being forty (40) feet in width, in an West-erly direction approximately 650. feet.


It is hereby ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED, that the said streets shall be hence forth a part of the road system of Covington Township.

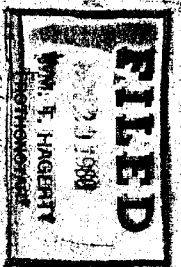
