To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of
Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of
Clearfield,

The petition of the undersigned res-
pectfully represents, that a petition for a
Public road "leading from Coal Run to the
Pike near Rockton, and to intersect a road
running past Blanchard's Camp and inter-
secting the Pike West of Johnston's Mill in Union
Township", was confirmed by your said Court on
the 15. day of January A.D. 1866. And that said
road is unnecessary, as there is a road run-
ning parallel with the same already laid
out and opened, for of the entire length
of the same, and said new road is useless
and wholly unnecessary. The petitioners there-
fore pray the Court to inquire of and vacate
said road, and for that purpose to appoint
three persons qualified according to law to view
said road, and inquire of the premises and
make report of their proceedings at the next
term of this Court.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the 25th day of *January* A. D. 1867 before the Judges of the said Court upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of *Union* in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway ^{of vacation} to lead from *Coal Run* to

*the Pike near Rockliffe and to intersect
a road running past Blanchard's
Camp and intersecting the pike
west of Johnstons Mill.*

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ^{*vacate*} ~~lay out~~ the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

John Saboree. James Irwin & Samuel McClaskey

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to ^{*vacate*} ~~lay out~~ the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

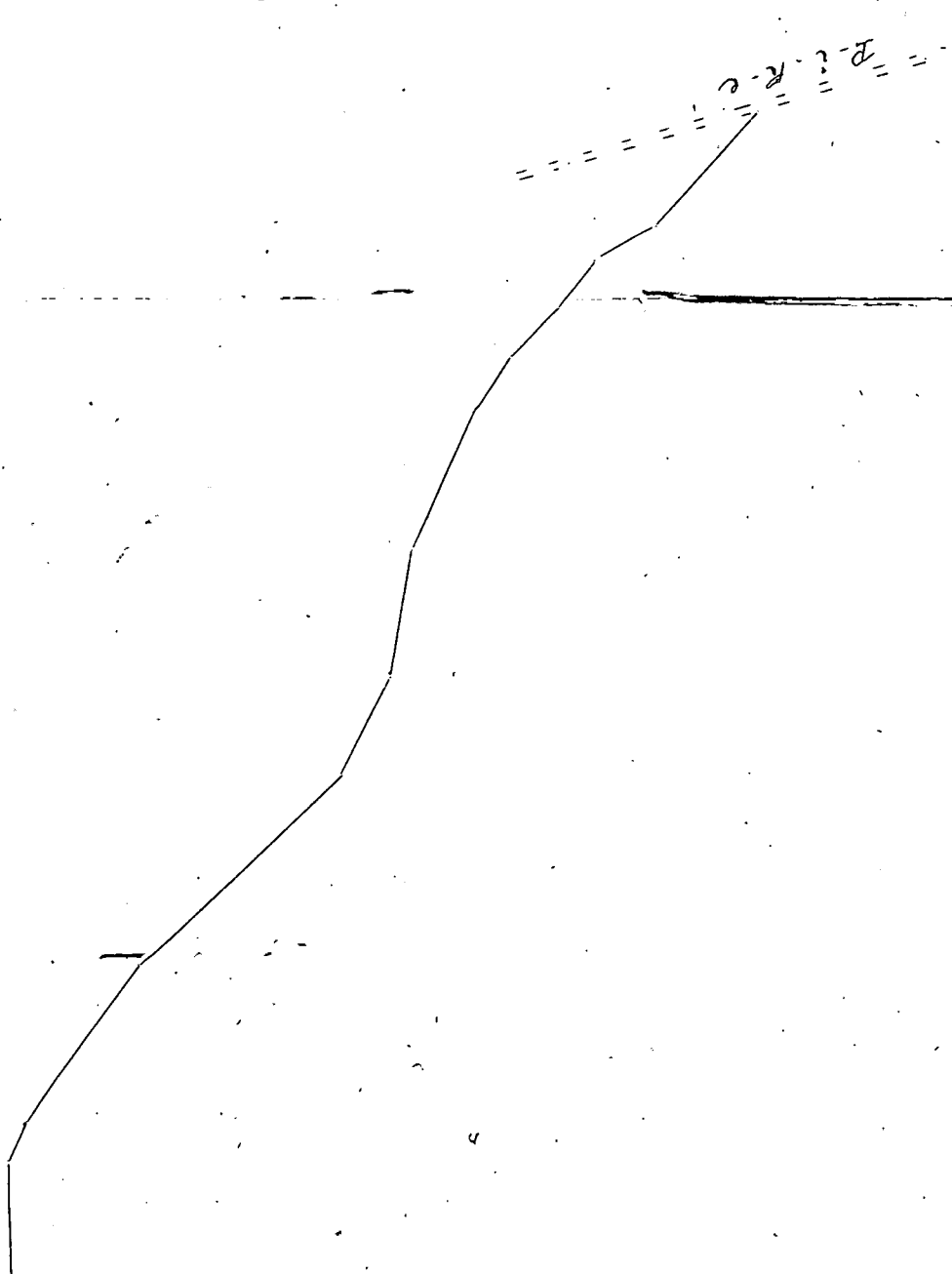
