PETITION TO DISCONTINUE


NOW COMES Lola M. Youngren by her attorney, John K. Reilly, Jr., and for her petition represents:


1. That she is the Plaintiff in the above captioned divorce action and her husband, Verner C. Youngren is the Defendant.

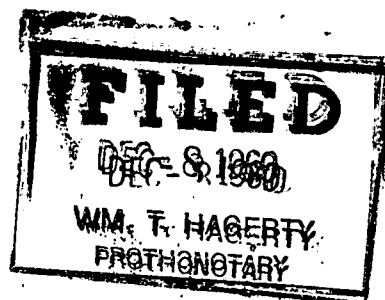

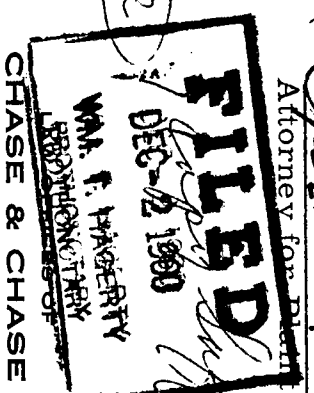

C O M P L A I N T

TO THE HONORABLE JOHN J. PENTZ, PRESIDENT JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

LOLA M. YOUNGREN files this Complaint in action of Divorce against VERNER C. YOUNGREN and for her cause of action states:

1. That Lola M. Youngren is the Plaintiff and Verner C. Youngren is the Defendant. Neither is a minor nor an incompetent.

2. The Plaintiff and Defendant were married in the City of Dubois, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, On October 17, 1952 by Reverend Lundberg, a Lutheran Minister. There were no children born to this marriage.

3. At the time of their marriage, the Plaintiff was a resident and citizen of the Borough of Curwensville, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, and the Defendant was a resident and citizen of the City of DuBois, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

4. The Present address of both the Plaintiff and the Defendant is Rockton, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

5. The Plaintiff has resided in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for over a period of fifty (50) years.

6. The Plaintiff avers that beginning on or about 1954 and continuing up until the present time, the Defendant did offer such indignities to the person of the Plaintiff


tiff, the injured and innocent spouse, as to render her condition intolerable and life burdensome.

7. The Plaintiff avers that beginning on or about 1954, the Defendant did, by cruel and barbarous treatment endanger the life of the injured and innocent spouse, the Plaintiff herein.

8. That there is no agreement or collusion between the Plaintiff and Defendant as to the bringing of this Divorce Action.

9. That neither of the parties to this Divorce Action have ever commenced or initiated a prior action for divorce.

WHEREFORE, the Plaintiff prays that she be freed and separated from the bonds of matrimony heretofore contracted between the said Plaintiff and Defendant and be granted a decree of divorce a "vinculo matrimonii" dissolving the bonds of the said marriage.
