The Petition of Elias Walk of the town-  
ship of Decatur, in the said County, respectfully represents that  
the Tyrone and Blairfield Railroad Company have surveyed,  
ascertained, located, fixed, marked, and determined a route for  
a Railroad, and have begun and are proceeding with the con-  
struction of the same; - that, without your Petitioner's consent,  
they have entered upon his lands in the said township of De-  
catur in the said County of Blairfield, and have established  
and partly constructed thereon the said rail-road; - that they  
made no agreement with your Petitioner to pay him any com-  
pensation for the damage done and likely to be done to, or  
sustained by him, by reason of the said company entering
