

Served on Defendant by handing a true and attested copy thereof, to Richard Unsworth personally at his home, 205½ Forest Ave., Du Bois, Pa., So answers, Alex Campbell, Constable on oath.

And Now Sept. 27, 1960 at 9.00 P.M. case is called. Plaintiffs appear in person, with witnesses. Defendant appears in person Plaintiffs and Defendant sworn according to law. Plaintiffs present bill in the amount of 52.89 issued by Chuck's Body Shop, 224 Morrison Street, Du Bois, Pa. for damages done to Plaintiffs car when struck and damaged by car driven by the Defendant.

Witness sworn according to law.

The Plaintiffs car was parked on parking lot at corner of Spruce Alley and S. Jared Street when struck and damaged by car driven by Richard Unsworth who failed to stop at the scene of the accident but was seen by Raymond and Helen of 12½ S. Jared St., Du Bois, Pa. who reported it immediately to the Prosecutors. Yesnukis

Witnesses testified that they saw the accident and talked to the Defendant after the accident.

Judgment publically proclaimed for the Plaintiffs. and against the Defendant for the repairs as present by the Plaintiffs in the amount of \$52.89 int \$1.56., Aldermans costs \$7.50 and Constable Costs. \$5.60.

Now, this 31st day of Dec, 1960 Copy of Transcript mailed to Wm. T. Hagerty, Clerk of Court requesting that the operating privilages of Defendant be lifted as provided by law.


