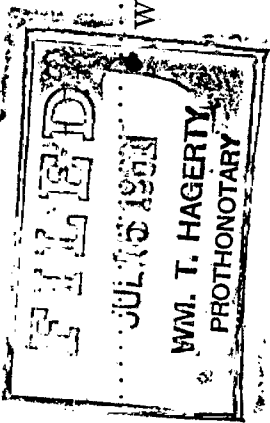

And Now Sept. 27, 1960 at 9.00 P.M. case is called.
Plaintiffs appear in person, with witnesses.
Defendant appears in person
Plaintiffs and Defendant sworn according to law.
Plaintiffs present bill in the amount of 52.89
issued by Chuck's Body Shop, 224 Morrison Street,
Du Bois, Pa. for damages done to Plaintiffs car
when struck and damaged by car driven by the
Defendant.
Witness sworn according to law.

The Plaintiffs car was parked on parking lot at
corner of Spruce Alley and S. Jared Street when
struck and damaged by car driven by Richard Unsworth
who failed to stop at the scene of the accident but
was seen by Raymond and Helen, of 12½ S. Jared St.,
