AT a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the ~~fourteenth~~ ^{twenty second} day of ~~January~~ ^{June} A. D. 1868, before the Judges of said court,

S. F. McCloskey, Richard Ellis and John D. Miller the persons appointed by an order

of the said Court of Quarter Sessions, last past, to view and lay out a road from *the fording at Mess Smiths to a*

point on the Road near Jacob Fryers in Bell Twp.

and Samuel Cauffman South 37 1/2° East 42 perches

thence on line of Samuel Cauffman and Sam. Jenkins

North 51 1/2° East 150 perches, thence North 74° East

18 perches, thence North 29 1/2° East 28 perches, thence

North 52° East 48 perches, thence on line of Jacob

Fryers and George Byres, 94 perches to a young

white pine, thence on line of George Byres and

Samuel Cauffman South 4 1/2° West 17 perches

to the Public Road.

a plot or draft whereof is to the said Report annexed, which Report being read the first time at *Sept 15, 1868 & Jan 11* Sessions last, and the second time on the *Sixteenth* day of

March instant, the Court approve of and confirm the said road for public use,

and order and direct that it be entered of record, and opened and cleared off the breadth of *33*

feet, except where digging or bridging is necessary and there to be *Sixteen* feet agreeable to

the courses and distances aforesaid, of which the Supervisors of the highways of the townships through which the said road runs are to take notice.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield,
held at Clearfield town, to and for said county, on the *18* day of
June A. D. 1868 before the Judges of the said Court upon
the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of *Beck*
in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience
for the want of a road or highway to lead from *the fording*
at Mrs. Smiths to a point near
Jacob Loyer.

Report as to same

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Richard Ellis, J. D. Miller and A. L. McCloskey

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

forty six degrees East. twenty two perches, North thirty six deg
East. Through Jenkins & Robt. McShaffee. One hundred and
twenty seven perches. North seventy six degrees East, sixty
five and five tenths perches. North fifty six and one half
degrees East; thirty five perches. North forty nine, East
forty perches. Thence on line of Robt. McShaffee, and Saml
Cauffman. South thirty seven and one half degrees
East; forty two perches. Thence on line of Saml. Cauffman
and Samuel Jenkins, North fifty one and one half East
One hundred and fifty perches, North twenty four degrees
East; Eighteen perches. North twenty nine and one half
degrees East; twenty eight perches. North fifty two deg
