Major Thiriot, and his Associate Judges of the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Clearfield, now composing a Court of General Quarter Session of the Peace in and for the said County at Sessions. The petition of divers inhabitants of Burnside Township, and parts adjacent, in the said County respectfully sheweth,

That your petitioners labor is under great inconvenience for want of a road beginning of the public road leading from Cross roads at Upper Mifflinburg in Burnside Township, to Ebenezerburg in the West Township, at a point where said road passes a certain meadow on lands of Isaac Lee, lying South East of said road at the North West corner of said meadow. Hence by the shortest and best road until it intersects the same road at the point where the West Township line crosses said road,

Your petitioners therefore respectfully pray your Honor to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, and to cause the above road where it is unfinished by this, according to law.

ROAD VIEWERS.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield in and for said county, on the _____ day of November, A. D. 1868, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Burnside, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from the cross roads at William Hartman to Newbury at a point where said intersects the same road at the point where the township lines crosses.

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

S. McCluskey, James Savage & John Cunningham who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
