law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration, had of the premises, do order and appoint
Collected to Samuel M. Davis and James M. Murray

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

We, the persons appointed by the annexed
 order of court do report that my persons
 after giving due and public notice according to
 law being duly sworn and affirmed
 all the views appointed by said order
 having viewed the ground proposed for the
 within mentioned Road and the undesignated
 views do agree there is occasion for a Road
 as desired by the petitioners and that the same
 is necessary for a public Road
 And having had respect to the shortest distance
 and least ground for such Road we have laid
 it out in such a manner as shall do the least
