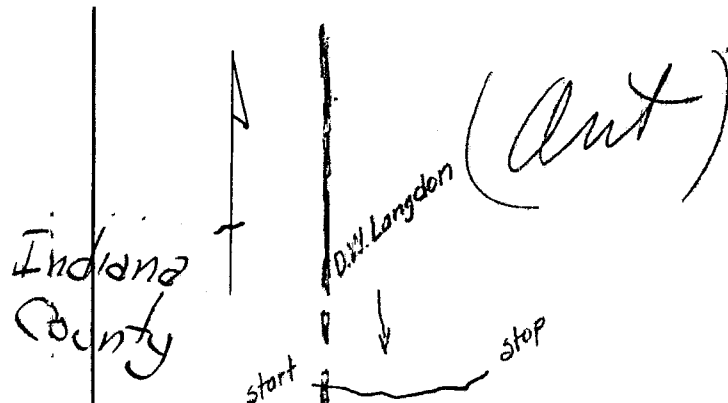

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the *18* day of *January* A. D. 186*8* before the Judges of the said Court upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of *Burnside* in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway to lead from *a public road*

leading from Indiana County line
to the point of a public road in said
township near Langdon's mill.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

John Mahaffey, Isaac Sheppard and Matt Brown

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

 of Court to view and lay out the road therein
 mentioned do report that in pursuance thereof
 after giving due and public notice according
 to law having been duly sworn and
 affirmed all the viewers appointed by said
 order having viewed the ground proposed
 for the within mentioned road and the
 undersigned viewers do agree there is occasion
 for a road as desired by the petitioners and that
 the dam is necessary for a public road
 And having had respect to the shortest diston
 and best ground for such road we have
 laid it out in such a manner as should do
 the least injury to private property and as
 far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the
 petitioners and do return for public use the
 following described road
 Commencing at the Indiana County line
 and intersecting road thereto thence upon an
 inclined plane through arable lands of Widow
 Moore South Eighty four Degrees East Sixty
 two perches thence South Seventy seven
 Degrees East forty perches thence through the
 improvements of David widow across one field
 North Eighty seven Degrees East thirty perches
 thence along this line of lands of David W. Langdon
 and David widow South Seventy four Degrees
 East thirty two perches thence through arable
 lands of David W. Langdon North seventy
 eight Degrees East Eight perches thence
 due East sixty perches thence through the
 improvements of David W. Langdon North
 Sixty Degrees East thirty one perches thence
 through the dam improvements North thirty
 six Degrees East eleven perches to the
 public road leading from Cherry tree to Langdon
 Hill and intersecting the dam at or near David
 W. Langdon on the Susquehanna River the entire
 length of road two hundred & seventy one perches or
 plot or draft whereof is herewith annexed which
 said road is as afore said laid out is in our
 opinion necessary for a public road And we assess
 the damages done to the said widow Moore by
 this laying out of this road twenty Dollars and
 damages sustained by David W. Langdon as follows
