Commencing on the Road leading from Youngs Church & to Gingsburgs Mill in said Township of Burnside & ~~view~~ ^{view} to commence near the Barn of John Mitchell and view to near little Beaver dam & end

Your petitioners therefore pray to the Court to appoint proper persons to Review the said road and adjacent parts and make report to the Court according to law.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the 18 day of

January A. D. 1868 before the Judges of the said Court upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of *Burnside* in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway to lead from *the Public road*

near John Mitchell's house to the little

Burnside Run.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to ^{see} view and lay out the same according to law. **Whereupon** the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Master Lewis. Daniel Brickley and S. H. McCluskey

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

To the Hon. The Judge within us.

We the undersigned persons appointed by the within Order of Court, to view and lay out the Road, therein mentioned. Respectfully report that having given notice of the time and place of the view of said Road, according to the Act of Assembly, and having been all present; at the view of the ground proposed for such Road, and having been first severally sworn, in pursuance of the said Order, we have viewed, and laid out, and do return, the following road, to wit; Beginning at a point in the Public Road near the Little Beaver Dam Run, Thence through land of Horace Patchin North thirty degrees East; seventy two perches, North sixty degrees West; fifty three perches, North thirty three and one half degrees East; sixty perches, North fifty two degrees East; thirty nine and five tenths perches, North forty four degrees East; seventy nine perches, North thirteen degrees East; twenty two perches, to line of Patchin & John & Robt. Young Thence through their land North four degrees East; twenty perches, North nineteen and a quarter degrees West; thirty four perches, North nine degrees East; twelve perches, North thirty nine and one half degrees East; twenty seven perches, North eighteen degrees East; at it eleven perches cross line of Young and Thomas and Alexander Thompson, forty one and four tenths perches, North sixty five degrees East; seventy four and five tenths perches, North thirteen and one half degrees East; (through Horace Patchin's land) thirty three and seven tenths perches, North fifty two and one half degrees East;

thirty four perches, North fifty and one half degrees East; sixty four perches, North two and one half degrees East; eleven perches, North sixteen and one half degrees East; twenty eight perches, to a point on line of John Mitchell and Aaron Patchin, Thence through John Mitchell's land South eighty four degrees, forty two perches, to the Public Road near John Mitchell's Barn,

A Point on which is hereunto annexed, which said Road, so, as aforesaid laid out, we are of opinion, is necessary for a Public Road.
