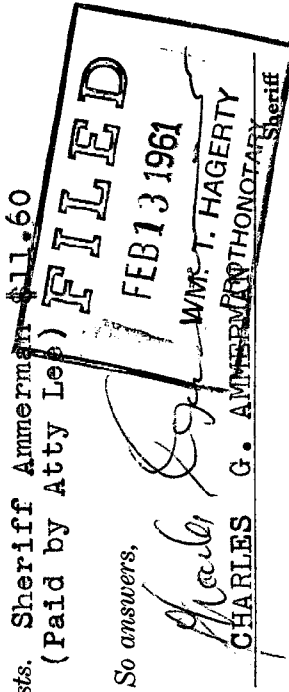

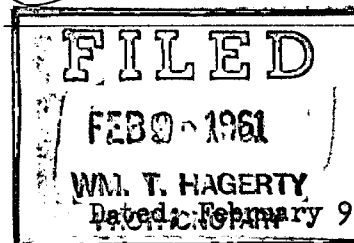



Trespass

C O M P L A I N T

COMES NOW, the plaintiff, and by his attorney, Joseph J. Lee, brings this action in trespass against the above named defendant upon a cause whereof the following is a statement:

(1). The plaintiff, James T. Barnes, is an individual and resides at 523 Maple Avenue, DuBois, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

(2). The defendant, Wilson Bakeries, is a Pennsylvania corporation with its place of business in DuBois, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

(3). On or about November 1, 1958, at approximately 8:00 A.M., the plaintiff owned a 1954 Model Packard Sedan which he was driving in a westerly direction on East Park Avenue near the intersection of said street and North Brady Street, DuBois, Pa.

(4). At the time and place aforesaid the defendant owned a delivery truck which was being operated by Joseph Dush on West Park Avenue near the intersection of said street with North Brady Street. The said Joseph Dush was the agent or employee, or both, of the defendant and was at the time and place aforesaid operating the said truck within the scope of his employment and with the knowledge and consent of the defendant.

(5). At the time and place aforesaid the plaintiff, at the aforesaid intersection of North Brady Street and East Park Avenue, attempted to make a left turn onto North Brady Street; at the same time the said Joseph Dush while crossing North Brady

Street did so negligently operate the said truck as to cause it to collide with plaintiff's automobile, doing extensive damage thereto as more fully set out hereinafter.

(6). The defendant, through its employee, was negligent in that:

(a). The said Joseph Dush was driving as an excessive rate of speed under the circumstances.

(b). He failed to operate the said truck in the proper lane of traffic, but instead crossed over into plaintiff's lane.

(c). He failed to observe the provisions of the Motor Vehicle Code.

(7). As a result of the aforesaid negligence the defendant's truck struck the front end of plaintiff's car causing damages thereto to the total amount of \$236.35, as set out in the schedule attached hereto and made a part hereof and marked Exhibit "A".

(8). The amount in controversy is less than \$2000.00.

WHEREFORE, the plaintiff demands of the defendant the sum of \$236.36, with damages for delay.
